The Pew Perspective: Commentary from Members

Besides Vacation Bible School, one of the most significant activities our Church will undertake this summer is the revision of our constitution, which dates to 1972. The Constitutional Revision Committee (CRC) will spearhead this task. The other members, who are Flora Gilliam, Eric Engle, Tod Luhn, and Pastor Joe, will meet on July 20th to review and discuss proposed changes to the way our Church is governed. Out of this meeting, the CRC will submit a constitution for the Church to review and evaluate.

As a political science student and a Baptist, I am doubly excited by this opportunity to serve on the CRC. Constitutions and rules of governance, and why they succeed or fail, are part and parcel of what I study and teach at GWU. Similarly, as a Baptist, I share with you the conviction that a church should not be ruled by a supreme leader or a group of wise elders. Rather, we as a local and autonomous congregation are to rule ourselves according to democratic principles. It is therefore up to us to determine the rules by which we will guide our decisions—and to make sure the rules we adopt are beneficial to our needs.

But what exactly is a constitution, and what makes a constitution a good one? This is the task set before the CRC. Very briefly, I would suggest that a constitution is a written agreement between the members of a community that creates and defines the powers and limitations of office-holders and their government, as well as enumerating the rights and responsibilities of the community members.

And what makes a constitution a success or a failure? A good constitution is like the framework of a house. The framework determines the spacing of windows, walls, and doors, but does not control the eventual paint color of the building, or how a room will be furnished. Therefore, a good constitution only delimits the broad outlines of government, and leaves more specific choices to be decided upon after it has been established. Did you know that the United States Constitution is only seven pages long, but has only been amended 17 times since 1800? Our national constitution's longevity can be largely explained by its brevity and succinctness—a characteristic I hope we can replicate here at Barnesville Baptist Church.

After we submit our proposed constitution to the Church, probably in early August, the CRC will ask for your questions, opinions and suggestions. Until then, please pray for the CRC as we begin this very important endeavor.

Vacation Bible School July 29 – Aug. 2

The Theme of the 2002 VBS is "Amazon Outfitters: On Expedition With The One True God". Vacation Bible School is a fun-filled spiritual adventure that provides concentrated Bible study and encourages real-life application. The intention of VBS is to reach people of all ages, leading them to know and respond to Jesus Christ as led by the Holy Spirit. 'Amazon Outfitters: On Expedition with the One True God' will launch riberenos (people who live on the river) on a journey that will ultimately lead to "One God! One Saviour! One Lord!"

The visual theme of VBS is the Amazon River and the rain forest. "Outfitters" will guide "explorers" on this adventure.

Amazon facts: In the Amazon Rain Forest are over 500 types of mammals, 175 different lizards, 300 other reptile species, tree climbers of every kind, and a third of the world's birds!!

The rain forest is home to more than 1,500 types of butterflies.

The Amazon's treetop world is nine times the size of Texas.

The Amazon River is 4,000 miles long and at its mouth is 90 miles wide.

The rain forest gets about 6 ½ feet of rain each year. Some places get as much as 18 feet.
