And it came to pass in those days that a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. Luke 2:1

The phrase "and it came to pass" occurs throughout Scripture 69 times. It is used when God fulfilled some promise or moved in some exciting way. For example, the following Biblical stories begin with the phrase "and it came to pass": Noah's flood, the destruction of Sodom & Gomorrah, the death of the firstborn of Egypt, the end of the Hebrews' slavery, and the reception of the Ten Commandments. In the New Testament, the phrase is used four times, one of which is the *Luke* passage describing the Roman census that compelled Joseph and Mary to return to the city of their fathers, Bethlehem, birthplace of King David.

What an exciting story that came to pass in the subsequent chapters of *Luke* and the other Gospels. The plot focuses on a Baby born of a virgin, announced by the heavenly host, worshiped by shepherds abiding in their fields, visited by wise men from the East, and illuminated by a westward-leading star.

Jesus, in the act of His birth, fulfilled numerous prophecies about the place and time of His birth, His lineage, and His purpose. The angel Gabriel told Mary to name her child Immanuel, meaning "God with us." Ever since the first prophecy of a Messiah found in *Genesis 3:15*, the Jewish people had expected a Savior to come to them and save them, especially after the Roman occupation of Judea. However, when Jesus entered a world that was a "low land of sin and sorrow", He came to rescue the Jewish people (and the rest of humanity) from spiritual darkness and bondage to sin. Jesus could have chosen to come as a conquering king and military hero. But instead, His arrival was modest and humble. Sure, there were the angels and shepherds on the first night, but the socially disreputable pregnancy of Mary, the indignity of the manger, the murderous hostility of King Herod, and the midnight flight to Egypt were not the most glamorous circumstances to greet Jesus.

The Christmas story is only important because it initiates the life of Jesus, which culminated in the Easter story. The line from the carol, "Hark the Herald Angel Sing", reminds us that Jesus was, "Born that man no more may die." In the upcoming months, let us remember, "that it came to pass" that the Christmas babe grew up to be the Passover Lamb for our sins and transgressions. What a wonderful story.

B. God the Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit is the Spirit of God, fully divine. He inspired holy men of old to write the Scriptures. Through illumination He enables men to understand truth. He exalts Christ. He convicts men of sin, of righteousness, and of judgment. He calls men to the Saviour, and effects regeneration. At the moment of regeneration He baptizes every believer into the Body of Christ. He cultivates Christian character, comforts believers, and bestows the spiritual gifts by which they serve God through His church. He seals the believer unto the day of final redemption. ⁴Joseph also went up from Galilee, out of the city of Nazareth, into Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, ⁵to be registered with Mary, his betrothed wife, who was with child. ⁶So it was, that while they were there, the days were completed for her to be delivered. ⁷And she brought forth her firstborn Son, and wrapped Him in swaddling cloths, and laid Him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn.
