Beginning July 6, I will start a series of messages on the great "I AM" declarations of Jesus in the *Gospel of John*, which is to many Christians their very favorite book in the whole Bible. I pray that as you read and study the Scriptures and hear the messages, you will see a clearer portrait of our Savior, who He is, and why He is worthy of our praise.

"They [the Bereans] received the Word with all readiness, and searched the Scriptures daily to find out whether these things were so" (Acts 17: 11b).

The Pew Perspective

Barnesville Baptist is beginning its buildup toward a week of high intensity activity for our annual Vacation Bible School, which is our Church's most significant community outreach and evangelism effort every year. I have attended VBS as a student, helper, or teacher every summer since kindergarten, and it has been a formative experience in my life. Even today, I can still not get a VBS song out of my head that I learned at least 15 years ago... "Come on along on a Son-Seeker safari! Come on a long and safari with me! The adventure's just beginning, we're having lots of fun...". Don't ask me to sing it for you, but my point is that the seeds we plant during VBS can bear fruit throughout a young person's life. The multiple experiences I had at VBS set the stage for my own profession of faith. VBS attendance has had a similar effect on many other youth. The Southern Baptist Convention recorded 109,045 professions of faith, as well as 289,679 prospects, and 50,000 new Sunday School members for VBS 2001 (Truth Trackers), the most recent year available. Even if a week of VBS goes by without a single response to the Gospel message or visit to Sunday school the week after by the students, do not be discouraged. As Jesus told his disciples, the harvest will come in its own time.

"...Behold, a sower went out to sow. And as he sowed, some seed fell by the wayside; and the birds came and devoured them. Some fell on stony places, where they did not have much earth; and they immediately sprang up because they had no depth of earth. But when the sun was up they were scorched, and because they had no root they withered away. And some fell among thorns, and the thorns sprang up and choked them. But others fell on good ground and yielded a crop: some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty" (Matthew 13:3-8).

So, invite your friends and neighbors to join us this July as we try and "crack the character code". Despite the hazy, hot, and humid weather we have every summer, you will be blessed for working in the Master's garden.

Baptist Faith and Message, Part IX

IX. The Kingdom

The Kingdom of God includes both His general sovereignty over the universe and His particular kingship over men who willfully acknowledge Him as King. Particularly the Kingdom is the realm of salvation into which men enter by trustful, childlike commitment to Jesus Christ. Christians ought to pray and to labor that the Kingdom may come and God's will be done on earth. The full consummation of the Kingdom awaits the return of Jesus Christ and the end of this age.

BFM Reflection: "The Kingdom"

As creator, God is absolute ruler over His universe. In much of the Bible, however, God's "kingdom" does not refer so much to a place as it does to a rule — God's dominion over the lives of individuals. It is not a worldly kingdom (*John 18:36*). Hence, for Matthew the terms "kingdom of Heaven" and "kingdom of God" are synonymous.

The rule of God in people's lives was a favorite theme of Jesus' teaching. He taught that it is near — as near as the individual's response to his message. He emphasized how it was "within" the hearts of individuals and the community of disciples who embraced God's rule over their lives (Luke 17: 20-21).

A good activity for the summer would be to use your Bible and a good Bible commentary on the book of *Matthew* and study the 13th chapter, verses 1-52. Read the parables of Jesus concerning the "kingdom of Heaven". As you read the Scripture and study ask the Holy Spirit to help you get a new and deeper understanding of God's Kingdom.

"Your kingdom come. Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven" (Matthew 5:10).

Report from the Monthly Business Meeting in May:

- A motion to define the rules of standing committee procedure was introduced and referred to the Internal Administration Committee.
- The Church approved the payment of \$175 lawn care treatments of the Church grounds to control dandelions.
- The Groundsmen have received several differing diagnoses and estimates to repair the belfry.

- The standing committees have not reported back yet on the motion to create job descriptions for positions not defined by the Church Constitution, which was due at the March business meeting.
- An Auditing Committee has not been appointed yet to perform the audit of the Church's finances, which was due at the March business meeting.
