The Pew Perspective

On July 4, 1776, the Continental Congress approved a document authored by Thomas Jefferson declaring the United States to be independent from Great Britain and King George III. The Declaration of Independence was an indictment by the American colonists against the British for violations of Americans' rights, violations severe enough to warrant the separation of the American colonies from British rule. Jefferson proclaimed that the rights Americans valued came not from personal taste, or societal norms, or from the government. Rights come from God Himself. Thus, the famous passage, "We hold these Truths to be self-evident: that all Men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty, and the Pursuit of Happiness".

Americans, and indeed all men throughout all time can claim their liberties and freedom because they are the universal and timeless gift of the Creator. The inherent value and dignity of each and every human life is proclaimed throughout the Bible from cover to cover. "So God created man in His own image, in the image of God He created them; male and female He created them" (Genesis 1:31). Just as we respect God, we must demonstrate respect for his human creations, which were made like Him, with His attributes of reason, intelligence, and personality. This requirement for mutual respect was further repeated in the Old Testament Law. The Ten Commandments demand that: "You shall not murder...You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor ... You shall not covet ... anything that is your neighbor's" (Exodus 20:13, 15, 17). Additionally, it was expected that "... You shall love your neighbor as yourself: I am the LORD" (Leviticus 19:18), which Jesus echoed in the New Testament, recorded in Matthew 22:40 as the second greatest commandment, the first and greatest being to love the LORD your God. Christians are doubly-required to love and respect all men, not only as co-equal created beings, but as witnesses to the love of God to mankind through Jesus. "And this commandment we have from Him: that he who loves God must love his brother also" (I John 4:21).

The Founding Fathers were familiar with such biblical language, and were easily able to assume the self-evident truths of equal worth and equal rights for all mankind. The further the world gets away from such truths, the easier it becomes to devalue the life and the worth of the weak, poor, and downtrodden among us. It is hard to explain why we should care about the lives and rights of others without understanding the origin of human life and rights, especially when no one else seems to care and we can get ahead by devaluing others. But what other basis could the weak, poor, and downtrodden Americans of 1776 used to justify to the British and indeed the whole world, that their lives, liberties, and pursuit of happiness had value and meaning, absent the moral authority of God's Word? I thank God that the rights and liberties I enjoy as a citizen of the United States are a gift from Him. As you celebrate your independence this Fourth of July, take some time to thank God for our common birthright of freedom.

BFM Reflection: "Last Things"

A "feeling" pervades many evangelicals that we indeed are the "terminal generation." The 2000 Baptist Faith and Message statement on "Last Things" is a judiciously written statement that provides insight into some of the most significant events in the future and at the same time can be embraced by believers from various millennial perspectives.

The initial sentence affirms God's sovereign control of history. Christians are confident in the final outcome of history because we believe that God is sovereignly directing history toward its pre-ordained conclusion.

The next sentence affirms Jesus Christ's return. Significant areas of agreement exist among evangelicals in regards to Christ's Second coming. First, evangelicals believe that Jesus Christ's return will be sudden, personal, visible and bodily. Second, believers should anxiously await Christ's return (*Titus 2:12; Philippians 3:20*).

A third area of agreement is that we cannot know the time of His return; however, Jesus encouraged his followers to be vigilant as we await His coming.

Finally, evangelicals agree that believers will live with Jesus Christ in a new heaven and a new earth.

Business Meeting Briefs

Report from the Monthly Business Meeting in June:

- The Church voted to roll over its certificate of deposit for a six-month period.
- The Church approved a \$175 fertilizer treatment of the Church grounds.
- The Church budget was amended to reimburse Kitty Cooley \$300 for the remainder of the 2003 fiscal years for flowers.
- Randy and Sandy Gilliam were approved by the Church to serve as messengers to the Southern Baptist Convention this month, and were given a \$600 stipend for travel expenses.
- The Church authorized the outlay of \$700 to *Rushing Wind*, plus the proceeds from a love offering during their two concerts.

Expected at the July Business Meeting:

- The Finance, Outreach, and Worship committees are expected to report back on the motion to define job descriptions for offices under their jurisdictions.
- The Education Committee is also expected to report back on the job description motion as well as a motion from the Deacons to study the issue of moving the Nursery upstairs.
- The Internal Administration committee will report back on the job description motion, a motion to study the possibility of building a "crying room", and the motion to define the rules of standing committee procedure.
- An Auditing Committee has not been appointed yet to perform the audit of the Church's finances, which was due at the March business meeting.

Reports from Phoenix

Thank you for allowing Pastor Randy & me to attend the SBC Annual Meeting as your messengers. The sessions were Spirit-filled and we had the sense of belonging to a very long tradition of Christian beliefs and teachings. The music provided by a 400-voice choir and full orchestra created the atmosphere for the Holy Spirit to work freely. Every message was focused on the SBC theme of "Building Kingdom Families", the emphasis of our denomination for the next year. We have a responsibility to do what it takes to enable our families to "seek first the kingdom of God".

The plight of some of our SBC missionaries came home to me when Don and Terry Caswell spoke to us. Don is a pharmacist who worked in the Jibla Baptist Hospital in Yemen. On December 30, 2002, a gunman entered the hospital, shot and killed 3 missionaries (Martha Myers, William Koehn, and Kathleen Gariety) and wounded Don, shooting him twice. He and Terry spoke briefly about this traumatic experience and his recovery. Terry said that while praying about where they should serve God in the future, He gave them Luke 6:27, "But I tell you who hear me: Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you...". With a strong voice of conviction, she said they will be returning to Yemen on August 1, 2003. Please join us in praying for Don & Terry and their sons, Thomas, age 11, and Caleb, age 5.
