## The Pew Perspective

Starting in August, the men of Barnesville Baptist, as a group, will become more visible and active. This is not to say that the men of our Church have been idle; but rather that they have participated as individuals. Already, there is a nucleus of men who have been meeting for the last several months, searching for opportunities to serve. Why is it important that the men of the Church join together in service? In the Old Testament, Solomon explains that, "Two are better than one, because they have a good reward for their labor. For if they fall, one will lift up his companion. But woe to him who is alone when he falls, for he has no one to help him up" (Ecclesiastes 4:9-10). In the New Testament, Paul similarly exhorts group service: "And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works, not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching" (Hebrews 10:24-25). Cooperation is a good idea; but to what end? Again, Paul supplies an answer: "Be kindly affectionate to one another with brotherly love, in honor giving preference to one another; not lagging in diligence, fervent in spirit, serving the Lord; rejoicing in hope, patient in tribulation, continuing steadfastly in prayer; distributing to the needs of the saints, given to *hospitality"* (Romans 12:10-13). The Bible, through specific exhortations and in the life stories of the heroes of faith, calls men, as men, to service and leadership in their homes and in the Church. These principles of love, service, encouragement, prayer, and hospitality are bedrock principles of faith-in-action that the Baptist Men desire to show forth in our own lives. Just as Jesus taught, clinging to these principles will guide men and their families throughout the storms of life. "Therefore whoever hears these sayings of Mine, and does them, I will liken him to a wise man who built his house on the rock: and the rain descended, the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house; and it did not fall, for it was founded on the rock" (Matthew 7:24-25).

In the future, you will see, or at least notice the effects of, the Baptist Men's efforts to serve the Church and our community, and to build up and encourage the men of the Church in their faith. Our first activity will be the Father-Child Banquet on August 12, when we will model Christian fellowship and encourage the fathers and children in our congregation to grow in their devotion to the Lord and participation in His work through the Church. The Baptist Men invite all the men of Barnesville to participate in our common endeavor to grow together as Christian men.

#### **Faith of our Fathers**

This month we conclude the story of how our Fellowship Hall and Sunday School facilities came to be. The following is a minimally-edited account of the construction, taken from our Church archives.

The week, or so, following this [groundbreaking] service, Wilson Magaha worked with the bulldozer in digging the hole for the basement. Other men worked to tear off the back portion of the Church. At different times, men worked to cut down trees and trim off the brush. The R.A. boys helped to clean up the grounds, round about so as to make them usable. On Wednesday, Oct. 13, 1954 the Congregation met at the Church to discuss the matter. After considerable discussion a written ballot was taken. Those present and voting agreed that the Church should build at two story building with a basement for S.S. purposes.

On Wednesday, Dec. 1, 1954, at the regular monthly business meeting, those present passed a motion changing the extent of the building to be built. It was moved that the Building Committee be authorized to change the plans as agreed upon at the Special Business Meeting, Oct. 13, 1954, reducing the building from a two story building to a one story building with a basement and the addition to the Church auditorium. The plans were taken to Chas. Bowers in Frederick for alterations.

On Saturday, Jan. 15, 1955 Dick Brown and his man, with men and boys of the Church, hauled the logs to Marshall White's for cutting. The latter is to cut them for cost, as his contribution to our building project. This may be considered the first bill for building material. The handling of the logs and the lumber afterward is to be D. Brown's contribution to our project.

On Jan. 17, Wm. Webb came and with the assistance of some Church men, squared up the basement in preparation for the digging of the footings. An order for additional building materials—blocks, etc., was given this day. On Jan. 18, Webb's men began digging for the footings and had them ready for the pouring of concrete by Wednesday. On Jan. 21, the footings were poured. On Jan. 24, the first blocks were laid. (No work has been done on the building since Jan. 31).

The first bill for material was paid Feb. 9 to Rockville Fuel & Feed Co. for 9 yds. of concrete \$137.25. No work has been done on the building since Apr. 1. Lumber for the rafters and roof needed. Ground was filled in around the building and stumps removed—Apr. 20. Roof completed—July 1955. Application of loan from Citizens Bldg & Loan approved Aug. 26. Completion of loan held up because of technicality in deed. Mortgage completed Jan. 11, 1956. Work resumed Jan. 14. First loan advance made Jan. 17; received Jan. 23. Contract for heating Jan. 16. Completed Feb. 21. Wiring begun Feb. 11. Plastering begun Feb. 20, finished Mar. Chairs, desks, etc received from School Board Feb. 22. Well digging begun Feb. 16. Completed Feb 22. 103 ft. depth. Plumbing started Mar. 9. Trim work begun Mar. 13. Addition to Church finished sufficiently for use Easter Sunday Apr. 1.
