The Pew Perspective

As a Sunday School teacher, I have found that you often learn as much as the students you are teaching. Not only do you have to understand the text yourself, you have to be able to explain it to someone else. My class recently concluded the book of *Genesis*—all 50 chapters of it. One of the advantages of going through an entire book, rather than starting and finishing a new episode each week, is that you start noticing broad themes and patterns. What I noticed as a key theme in *Genesis* is the faithfulness of God across the generations, which I shared with my students, and now will share with you in this space.

Starting in the Garden of Eden, after Adam and Eve willfully chose to sin against God, a promise was given which is the first messianic prophecy in the Bible: "And I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between you seed and her Seed; He shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise His heel" (Genesis 3:15). God was faithful to keep His promise of redemption alive throughout earliest generations, preserving Noah and his family through the Flood even when He drowned a world full of wickedness and immorality. God's faithfulness was evident when he spoke to a man named Abraham, and told him to, "Get our of your country, from your family and from your father's house, to a land that I will show you. I will make you a great nation; I will bless you and make your name great; and you shall be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you, and I will curse him who curses you; and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed" (Genesis 12:1-3). God here promised three things to Abraham: an unseen land, a large family, and a worldwide blessing that would come out of his progeny. God kept this promise to Abraham and renewed this covenant with his son Isaac and grandson Jacob, and also the descendants of Jacob we know as the nation of Israel.

Throughout *Genesis* and the Old Testament, God is repeatedly referred to as the "God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob", a title which reminded the children of Israel that God had created and preserved this family out of all the peoples of the world for a purpose, first mentioned in Genesis 3:15. From our vantage point in history, we know that the Seed of the woman is none other than Jesus Christ, who was born a descendant of Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and Judah. The great blessing promised to Adam and Eve and to the patriarchs was fulfilled when Jesus died on the cross to take away our sins, and when he was resurrected to give us eternal life. Just as God kept his promises to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, He is also faithful to us in the modern day. I hope this theme of God's faithfulness found in the book of *Genesis* encourages you to trust in God and know that He loves you and will take care of you.

We are starting the book of *Exodus* next in my Sunday School class—I am sure this part of Scripture will also impart some more knowledge about the great God we serve.

Faith of our Fathers

This month we found some information on one of Barnesville's most beloved pastors, Rev. Horace C. DuBois (1953-1969). Our sanctuary is dedicated in his honor with a plaque on the balcony façade. The following comes from the bulletin for Rev. DuBois' memorial service and a letter in the Church archives.

Rev. Horace C. DuBois was born May 10, 1903, in Philadelphia, PA to Nellie and Clifford DuBois. He was educated in the public school system of Philadelphia, graduated from the Philadelphia College of the Bible in 1931 and the Eastern Baptist Theological Seminary in 1933. As a young man he dedicated his life to the Lord but, not able at that time to pursue full time Christian service, he became active in the Christian Endeavor movement in the Delaware Branch and served as president of that organization.

He began his ministry at the Heary Memorial Chapel in Philadelphia (1929-1934) and in 1932 he also became the pastor of the South Broad Street Baptist Church. April 23, 1938 he married Edith Wiest Ross and took on the responsibility of a ready-made family; Robert R. Ross and Muriel Irene Ross. September 24, 1943 a daughter was born to Horace and Edith and together they accepted the challenge the Lord had given them; to raise a very special child, Grace Myra.

In the same month he accepted a call to begin a full time ministry with the Gunpowder Baptist Church, Freeland, MD and the Turnpike Baptist Church, Hungerford, PA; serving until 1947. From January 1948 through July 1953 he served the Greensboro Baptist Church, Greensboro, MD. In August '53 he was called to the Barnesville Baptist Church and served until the completion of his active ministry, October 1969.

Rev. DuBois, Edith and Grace moved to Glen Burnie, and became active in the Glen Burnie Baptist Church and the Association of Retarded People. They rejoiced in Grace's progress at the Provident Center and enjoyed visiting former members of their congregations and taking part in the family celebrations of Bob's and Muriel's families.

In March 1986, after Grace Myra moved to her own home under Alternative Living, Inc., they moved to the Charlestown Retirement Community, Baltimore, MD and became members of the Shelbourne Baptist Church.

Rev. DuBois was called home by his Lord and Master, Jesus Christ, January 16, 1992. Many will remember his hearty laugh, his gentleman ways, his ability to quote scripture, and his beautiful manner of "talking with the Lord".

Report from the Monthly Business Meeting in August:



- The Church adopted bylaws creating the positions of Bereavement Coordinator (Outreach Committee) Nursery Coordinator and Children's Church Coordinator (Education Committee).
- The Church approved officer positions for the 2004-2006 term, for which the Nominating Committee will solicit those members willing to serve. The nominees' names will be presented to the Church in mid-September, and will be voted on in October.
- The Church voted to appropriate honorariums for two missionaries who will speak in September, and our October revival speaker.
- A motion to increase the budget allocation for Building Improvements by \$1000.00 was referred to the Internal Administration Committee.
