What are you going to do in February? This coldest of the winter months gives all of us the opportunity to spend more time inside, and maybe, more time talking (communicating) and sharing ideas, thoughts, concerns, and hopes with family members and others we love. One suggestion on how to spend some of February's inside time is to read over the book of *Proverbs* several times and ponder the "wisdom" of it. This book is a treasure of practical and godly wisdom. Even though the contents are from periods ranging from the 10th to the 6th centuries B.C., the wisdom and instruction offered are relevant today and address many of the values and morality-related questions which confront us. Husbands and wives, parents and children, and all who by experience and age are the respected "sages" among us would benefit from reading and re-reading this book.

Major themes in *Proverbs* include reverential respect and awe toward a sovereign God; the power of human speech to hurt and to heal; the virtue of monogamous marriage and the folly of sexual sin; the development of character by walking in the ways of wisdom; and the dangers and possible consequences of ignoring godly wisdom.



The Pew Perspective

I thought I'd share my 5th Sunday Discipleship Training class notes with you in the form of a column, especially since we are experiencing a pattern of church-canceling snowstorms. My topic, both in October and scheduled for January, is on miracles. First, what is a miracle? Webster defines a miracle as, "an extraordinary event manifesting divine intervention in human affairs", or, "an extremely outstanding or unusual event, thing, or accomplishment". The former definition is what I would term a Class A miracle—something that contravenes natural processes by suspending and/or overriding natural laws, or activating latent or unknown laws of nature. The latter definition would be a Class B miracle, which is accomplished within the framework of natural laws, but the specific timing, intensity, duration, and rate of the event are of very low probability.

To illustrate the difference, I would categorize the following miracles in the Bible as Class A: the Creation, the plagues on Egypt, Elijah calling down fire on Mt. Carmel, the Incarnation, Christ healing the blind and the lame, and the miracles of the apostles, just to name a few. These all involved the creation of new life, information, matter, energy, and complexity. Famous Class B miracles include Noah's Flood, the toppling of Jericho, Elijah's drought, Jesus finding His temple tax in a fish, and the earthquake at the Phillipian jail. All of these events took place within the framework of the regular laws of nature, but happened in such a time, place, and manner as to serve an intelligent, divine purpose.

Many skeptics question whether miracles are possible—they claim that natural laws are immutable, and that all events must have a natural explanation. The real question is not about miracles, but about God. Miracles can only occur if there exists an infinitely powerful, intelligent God who is *outside* the universe, but can act *within* the universe. If you can defend the existence of such a God (and you can), the possibility of miracles just falls into place.

Miracles are not just random events, designed to make the Bible more interesting to read. Miracles are caused by the purposeful, intelligent will of God through the power of the Godhead. They are performed either by God Himself, or through angels, prophets, or apostles. Miracles are intended to produce faith, obedience, prove Messiah-ship, and demonstrate prophetic/apostolic authority.

Miracles are rare. There are only 234 miracles listed in the Bible, occurring during crisis points in biblical history and located in a relatively small geographical area—Mesopotamia, Egypt, and Israel.

Miracles are distinct from magic. Miracles are under God's control, not available on command, have a supernatural origin, are associated with good and with truth, can overpower evil, affirm that Jesus is God in the flesh, and are never associated with occult practices.

If you don't get a chance to attend my Discipleship Training class, read the *John 9* account of Jesus healing a blind man and look for the following characteristics of a miracle. In verse 3, the <u>purpose</u> of the miracle is revealed. Verse 4 shows the <u>power</u> and the <u>agent</u>. Verses 17, 27, and 33 demonstrate the <u>faith</u> produced by the miracle. Verse 22 proves Jesus' <u>Messiahship</u>, and verse 38 highlights the <u>obedience</u> produced.

Barnesville Md. 9/29/1900

White which had been offered two weeks ago was accepted & A.G. Harley & France Wolfe directed to prepare suitable resolutions thereon. Bro. R.T. White was directed to secure Bro. Lewis F Jones to preach on Oct 14th next. By order & in behalf of the church

Barnesville Md. Sept 30, 1900

A meeting of the Barnesville Baptist Church was held this morning after regular services by the retiring Pastor, who preached an able and edifying sermon and Bro. R.T. White & Sister Mary Brown were appointed delegates to represent this Church in Md. Baptist Union Association which is to meet with Immanuel Baptist Church in Baltimore on the 24 proximo.

The committee on resolutions appointed at yesterday's meeting made the following report which was unanimously adopted.

Whereas in the economy of Divine Providence Rev. S.R. White, Pastor of the Barnesville Baptist Church, has felt it incumbent upon him to resign the Pastoral care of said church.

Therefore be it resolved

That it is a matter of profound regret to this church that our Pastor feels it is his duty to leave us.

That in Bro. White the church has had a model, faithful, & efficient Pastor. His sermons have been those of an able accomplished and God-serving divine, giving light strength & comfort to the membership and have been faithful warnings to the irreligious.

That as a man, As a Pastor and as a Christian gentleman he has fully met our ideal.

That we part with him with deep regret, and that we commend him to any and all with whom he may be thrown in the future as eminently worthy of their highest consideration their Christian confidence, love and esteem.

Laura Fels To Speak March 13

Laura Fels, of Chosen People Ministries, will speak at BBC during the morning worship service on March 13. Chosen People Ministries is made up of Jews and Gentiles who believe that Jesus is the Jewish Messiah. Their questions to everyone including the Jewish community are: "Do you know the Messiah?", or, "Are you curious?" Laura was born in Asheboro, North Carolina to a Gentile mother and Jewish father. When Laura was a baby, her family to her father's hometown of San Juan, Puerto Rico, where she grew up longing to know more about the religion of her Jewish grandmother. As Laura sought happiness and fulfillment, she rejected religion. Then, at the height of her career and social life, someone presented the Gospel to her. Unable to resist the wooing of the Lord, she vielded her life to Him. She later met Jewish believers who helped her understand the Jewishness of Christianity. Laura has served on the staff of Campus Crusade's Executive Ministries since 1986 in New York City and elsewhere. In 2001 she joined in a partnership with Chosen People Ministries, reaching Jewish executives.

If you have friends, especially Jewish friends, who need to ponder the two questions mentioned above, please invite them to come with you to BBC on March 13 and listen to Laura. This could be a life changing experience for many because of the power of God's word in the Gospel message.
