The Pew Perspective

The Apostle John is one of the most emphatic writers of the New Testament, boldly proclaiming the fact that Jesus is the Son of God and source of eternal life in a black and white, you're-either-with-us-or-against-us manner. In his eponymic gospel, John uses the word "believe" to urge people to faith in Christ over 100 times—twice as often as the other three gospel writers combined. With similar fervency, at the end of his first epistle, John tells Christians that there are five facts that they can know for certain, that they can have faith and confidence in, based upon their belief in Jesus and their saving relationship with Him.

First, Christians can know they have eternal life. "...You who believe in the name of the Son of God...know that you have eternal life (I John 5:13). Jesus, talking about His followers, said, "...I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; neither shall anyone snatch them out of My hand" (John 10:28). No one can separate us from Almighty God's love and fellowship.

Second, Christians can know that they have access to God through prayer. "... We know that He hears us, whatever we ask..." (v. 15). We can communicate with the Father through His Son, who intercedes on our behalf. The writer of Hebrews tells us that, "... we have a great High Priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession..., let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need" (4:14; 16).

Third, Christians can know that they have power over sin and temptation. "We know that whoever is born of God does not sin...and the wicked one does not touch him" (v. 18). Paul wrote that we devote our thoughts, words, and deeds to God's will when we become His children. "But now having been set free from sin, and having become slaves of God, you have your fruit to holiness, and the end, everlasting life" (Romans 6:22).

Fourth, Christians can know that we abide in Christ. "We know that we are of God…" (v. 19). In John 15:1-11, Jesus described Himself as the true vine, and His followers as branches, totally dependent upon the vine for life and fruitfulness. As we abide, or stay/remain with Jesus, we spiritually grow several ways: we love God, follow His commandments, know His will, know how to pray in His will, bear fruit, and finally, we know God's joy.

Fifth, Christians can know that Jesus is truly the Son of God. " ... We know that the Son of God has come and has given us an understanding..." (v. 20). Jesus came to reveal His Father to the world. John witnessed firsthand the life and ministry of Jesus Christ—His teaching, preaching, and healing, and His victory over sin, death, and the grave. It is from his eyewitness experience that John so forcefully advocates that we believe that Jesus is the Son of God, and that we can have eternal life with the Father in His name.

Report from the Monthly Business Meeting in April:


- The Church approved the Education Committee's request for an \$800 budget line for the Sunday School Honor Roll program.


of "Amazing Grace" took a closer look at the incomprehensible grace of


