## The Pastors' Spotlight

"For as we have many members in one body, but all the members do not have the same function, so we, being many, are one body in Christ, and individually members of one another" (Romans 12:4-5).

One of the Apostle Paul's favorite metaphors for the church was the Body of Christ. He presented this metaphor to the churches in Rome, Corinth, and Ephesus. His great desire was to help believers understand that they were all part of the Lord's ministry and that each one had been given unique gifts. Working together, these individual parts do the work of Christ all around the world.

VBS gives a marvelous example of the diversity in the church working together with unity of mind to accomplish a common goal. Anyone who has ever participated in VBS knows that it takes everyone working together to have a successful VBS experience. At BBC this July nearly 40 volunteers participated in our five-day VBS. VBS tasks included: promotion, obtaining literature, preparing food, decorating, setting up the tent, registering students, cooking for the picnic, leading in the joint worship rally, preparing craft activities, supervising recreation, preparing snacks, teaching classes ranging from 2 years through adult, preparing student recognition certificates and thank you cards for all the workers, and hosting the ice cream social for VBS students, workers and parents. The diversity of workers was astonishing. Volunteers included new and long-term members, as well as regular visitors and friends of BBC. Workers ranged in age from 13 years to 86 years old with all the diverse life experiences inherent in folks of different ages and backgrounds.

All of this was accomplished in a Christian atmosphere, i.e., "Be kindly affectionate to one another with brotherly love, in honor giving preference to one another" (Romans 12:10). Your pastors salute all who participated in VBS and offered the many children and parents an example of Christian love through Christ Jesus. Thank you and God bless you for exercising your special gifts in the Body of Christ.

#### The Pew Perspective

How have people come to attend and become members of BBC? Of the 17 people who have thus far responded to the "How s/he first came to BBC" query in the Member of the Month column, nine (53%) said they were invited to worship by a family member, friend, or the pastor. Four (24%) said that their eventual membership was due to their parents' attendance, and four (24%) said that they started coming when they moved into the local area. One of the four who said he came due to proximity also mentioned knowing many BBC members, so arguably 59% of respondents indicated that personal invitations from current attendees were responsible for their joining BBC. The 17 respondents are predominantly our most senior members by age (born pre-WWII) and/or church membership (measured in decades).

Again looking back through the *Lantern* archives, BBC has gained 34 new members since May 2002 (7 the first twelve months since 5/02, 10 the second year, 1 the third year, 14 the fourth year, and 2 more this month). My rough estimate is that 18 (53%) of the 34 were ministered to by the church or invited by friends and family. Seven (21%) of the 34 are children whose parents are numbered in the first 18. Nine more (26%) appear to have joined due to proximity.

It appears that by a ratio of more than 2:1, BBC has historically gained members by inviting friends and family to worship here, and by ministering to families in need. Another 25% of our membership comes from the natural growth of families. The final quarter consists of nearby residents.

I recently asked Pastor Joe why our church is growing, and he attributed the increased membership to a spiritual emphasis on prayer, worship and missions, as well as people responding to visitation and outreach. This matches very closely to the biblical model. Jesus told us in the Great Commission to go and make disciples, baptize them, and teach them. The first-century church in *Acts 2* focused on the following five functions: fellowship (showing care and love), discipleship (teaching), worship (praising God), ministry (meeting needs) and evangelism (sharing the Gospel).

Thinking about our church and its members, I can come up with examples of how we engage, to some extent, in all of these activities. We are especially good at fostering a climate of love, unity, and fellowship. Our per capita missions giving can put many larger churches to shame. However, my impression is that our community outreach and evangelistic efforts, outside VBS week, is not our strongest area. Our discipleship efforts, primarily Sunday School and discipleship training, have dedicated teachers, but student numbers are consistently lower than Sunday morning worship figures. Our children's Sunday School attendance is irregular at best.

Fellowship, discipleship, worship, ministry, and evangelism must be pursued with equal vigor. We are each responsible for engaging in these activities, and not leaving some to the pastors, the deacons, or other members. I can think of areas in my own spiritual walk where I am more comfortable and gifted, and areas where I need to grow. How did you come to join BBC? In what ways have you helped the church grow? What areas do you need to work on? Your answers will help determine the future growth of our congregation and God's Kingdom.
