The Pastors' Spotlight

"My sheep hear My voice, and I know them and they follow Me" (John 10:27).

Once the young lad Samuel understood that it was the Lord calling him, his response was, "Speak, for Your servant hears" (I Samuel 3:10). In the first declarative statement in the verse above Jesus informs those listening that He speaks to those who accept Him by faith and that they hear (understand) His voice. Like Samuel, Christians today can have the expectation that Jesus, through the Holy Spirit, "speaks" to His people. The speaking, while perhaps not audible, can be heard by those in tune with the heart and passion of Christ. The speaking could be received as ideas, as visions of specific ministries, as spiritual affirmation of God's calling, as a revelation of God's will for an individual's life or for the life of a church. Clara Scott expressed it this way in her wonderful hymn, "Open My Eyes, That I May See": "Silently now I wait for Thee, Ready, my God, Thy will to see; Open my ears, illumine me, Spirit divine."

We believe that the Holy Spirit is beginning to cast a vision for the members and friends of BBC. The vision calls for rallying men, women, and young people to take a stand for Christ and to be "listeners" for the Lord's voice. Jesus still speaks. His people still hear His voice. He knows each one intimately. And, when His people hear His voice, they will follow Him.

We need prayer warriors to lift up the members and leaders of BBC so that the Lord's vision becomes our vision. We need people to pray for the men and women and children God wants to touch in these next weeks and months. Please pray for God's will to be done in your life and in the life of BBC.

The Pew Perspective

It's good to be home again. I certainly enjoyed my time in Australia and the opportunity to work in and explore a part of the world I thought I'd never get to see in person. At the same time, I am happy to be back, close to the sights and sounds of home, near by my friends and family, to spend time with them, watch my little nephews get bigger every time I see them, and return to my regularly scheduled routine.

I am similarly pleased to sit again in the pews of Barnesville Baptist Church. Your prayers and correspondence were much appreciated these past two months; they gave me comfort and strength knowing that I was not alone or forgotten, even when so far away. Having been absent for so many Sundays this summer, I have an extra appreciation for David's statement, "I was glad when they said to me, let us go into the house of the LORD" (Psalm 122:1).

There are several other verses that have renewed meaning for me, words that shine out of the pages of the Bible a little brighter than before. For example, the admonition to, "... not forsak[e] the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching" (Hebrews 10:25). When your body lacks a certain vitamin or mineral in its diet, it creates a hunger and a craving for it. I guess there is a spiritual parallel, for I feel a need for an extra dose of vitamin B(BC). Just as I missed my natural family, I am glad to be in fellowship again with my church family. Even while I was having fun exploring the mountains and coastlines of Australia, part of me wanted to be cutting bamboo in the humid, buggy heat of VBS week.

As Paul explained to the Christians of Ephesus, we are not, "...strangers and foreigners, but fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God..." (Ephesians 2:19). Indeed, we, "...are being built together for a dwelling place of God in the Spirit..." (Ephesians 2:22). The "ties that bind" are strong indeed.

Many scriptures that speak of the church and God's people emphasize the fellowship of believers: walking, praying, and striving together in a common purpose and spirit. Consider David's words in Psalm 133:1: "Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity"! Or look at Paul's words to the church in Philippi: "...stand fast in one spirit, with one mind striving together for the faith of the gospel..." (Philippians 1:27). Over and over again the message of the New Testament is that the Church is a single, living being, with one Head, Jesus Christ. Muscles, organs, nerves, tendons, and bones work seamlessly together in a human body in a united effort for a common purpose. Even so, those who name Jesus as Savior are to join harmoniously together with a single will, that we, "...may with one mind and one mouth glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ" (Romans 15:6).

I don't anticipate any more international travel anytime soon, but that's quite all right. As the autumn season approaches, I look forward to spending time close to the people and places I care about the most.

Report from the Monthly Business Meeting in August:


- The Church approved the Pastor's nominations of five members (Randy & Sandy Gilliam, Lee Michael, June Ivey, and himself), plus an alternate (Nancy Cooley), to serve as messengers to the Montgomery Baptist Association Annual Meeting, being held on Oct. 11, 2008 at Barnesville Baptist.
- The Outreach Committee recommendation that a \$1000 offering be sent to Building HOPE Ministries was approved.
- The Church approved the membership applications of Eric & Margie Noegel, who both came by letter.

Expected at the September Business Meeting:

- The Select Committee on Nominations will recommend Margie Noegel to serve on the Education Committee as Sunday School Teacher for 3-5 year olds for the remainder of the 2006-2008 term, vice Resha Martin-Ahalt, resigned.
- The Select Committee on Nominations will offer motions to adjust the age range of two children's Sunday School classes and to increase the size of the Worship Committee from seven to eight members for the 2008-10 term.
