The Pastors' Spotlight

"I took you from the ends of the earth, from its farthest corners I called you. I said, 'You are my servant; I have chosen you. So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand'" (Isaiah 41:9-10).

It was with these verses that Cindy Batres began speaking on Sunday, Mar. 15. Cindy & Manuel Batres were called as missionaries about five years ago. It was exciting to hear Cindy and Manuel testify how faithful God has been to them



in all their experiences in Guatemala. He has upheld them with His "righteous right hand" by giving them a deep compassion for the Mayan people in northern Guatemala; by protecting them from physical harm in the mountainous terrain where they work; by caring and providing for their two daughters in Ohio; and

plants in Guatemala. According to Cindy & Manuel, what seemed at first like a great personal sacrifice to sell their possessions and move to a foreign country, God has turned into and inexpressible blessing. "God is so good!" Their ministry involves prefabricating metal structures for churches, schools, and living quarters for pastors. With the help of volunteer teams, they have built 250 permanent structures. Every time a team puts up a building, a village sees the love of Christ in the lives of those who come to help them. They work together, pray together, hold VBS classes, and demonstrate the love of Jesus in many other ways. Cindy & Manuel are finding ways to take the gospel of Christ to those people whom Jesus loves. Cindy & Manuel are very thankful for the BBC support they receive. They also hope that maybe sometime soon a BBC team will go to Guatemala and work with them to demonstrate the love of Christ.

The Pew Perspective

The resurrection victory of Jesus Christ on that first Easter Sunday morning has echoed throughout the pages of history, saving souls and changing lives. For those who follow Jesus and have put their faith in Him for salvation, the redeeming power of that resurrection will allow us to meet Him face to face one day.

Heaven is the place where God and His people will dwell together. The Apostle John foresaw that a "new heaven and a new earth" would replace the current universe (Revelation 21:1). People often wonder what we will be doing for the rest of forever. While some imagine heaven to be the longest choir practice ever, heaven's major focus is to serve as the location where God most fully makes known His presence to us so that we can fellowship with Him. Although it is true that we will praise God with joy and exult His triumph over evil forever (Revelation 5:11-13, 15:2-4, 19:1-6), John explained in his first epistle that the glory of heaven will be that the veil of mystery will be lifted, and we will have full communion with the Father. "Beloved, now we are children of God; and it has not yet been revealed what we shall be, but we know that when He is revealed, we shall be like Him, for we shall see Him as He is" (I John 3:2).

We will also feel at home in heaven, in fellowship with our Savior, the redeemed of all ages, and our loved ones who also put their faith in Christ's atonement. Jesus comforted His disciples by telling them that, "I will come again and receive you to Myself; that where I am, there you may be also" (John 14:3). Paul, for one, was looking forward to seeing Christ, writing that, "For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us" (Romans 8:18).

Whatever heaven will be, it will be somewhere nice. I have heard that the must luxurious, world-class hotels and resorts are "seven star" facilities. I can only imagine that heaven will merit "seventy times seven" stars for its wondrous splendor. Three times heaven is described in the New Testament as "paradise" (Luke 23:43, II Corinthians 12:4, Revelation 2:7). John goes on to explain that in heaven there will be no sin or suffering (Revelation 21:4, 27, 22:1-3), while Jesus taught that we will be rewarded in proportion to our faithful service to the Kingdom (Matthew 25:14-30).

Heaven will not be an idle place with nothing to do but lounge around on the clouds and pluck our harps. In reality, we will also have work—exciting, fulfilling missions—to do, ministering before God in His Kingdom. We are also told that we will serve God, as Christ "has made us kings and priests to His God and Father"; we will also reign with Christ and rule over the angels "…His servants shall serve Him…and they shall reign forever and ever" (Revelation 1:6; 22:3, 5).

As we remember Jesus' sacrificial love displayed on that first Good Friday, and celebrate His conquering of death, hell, and the grave, let us also look forward to the eternal blessings that await those who love Him.
