The Pastors' Spotlight

"If you love me, you will obey what I command. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Counselor to be with you forever--the Spirit of truth..." (John 14:15-17).

The Person and ministry of the Holy Spirit will be the subject of an important two-part message series beginning Feb. 14 at BBC. The third Person of the Trinity, the Holy Spirit is a vital part of the Christian's life. It is through the Spirit that we are convicted of sin, drawn toward salvation, and given assurance of life everlasting with the Father. The Holy Spirit also provides our strength, communicates our prayers, and teaches God's people about heavenly matters. He also empowers us to have daily victory as we follow after Christ, and bestows to us spiritual gifts to use in service for the Kingdom.



The Pew Perspective

Did you know that God has blessings already marked out for us, waiting to be delivered? In *Ephesians 1:3*, the Apostle Paul told those early Christians that our Heavenly Father has already blessed us according to the counsel of His will, writing, "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in Christ...". Just as we were predestined to adoption into God's family, blessings are in store and designated for our use. However, God's blessings do not automatically fall from the sky into our lives. Instead, we must walk by faith and prayerfully seek God's will for our lives, so we can understand why God wants to bless us with talents, resources, or His favor. There are actually several requirements that must be met, according to the Scriptures, before we will receive God's blessings. These include agreement, obedience, thankfulness, and continual effort and focus.

Agreement means that even though all the blessings God has for us are pre-approved, we must sign on as well. In *II Corinthians 1:19-20*, Paul wrote, *"For the Son of God, Jesus Christ, who was preached among you by us...was not Yes and No, but in Him was Yes. For all the promises of God in Him are Yes, and in Him Amen, to the glory of God through us".* Just as we must accept God's offer of salvation through Jesus Christ, we must also say "Amen" to God's "Yes" to His blessings. For example, the prophet Jonah was told to preach to Nineveh, but ran away from God's will. God let him run, but Jonah faced negative consequences until he agreed to support God's agenda. Once in step with God, Jonah saw great revival break out in the city of Nineveh where he preached repentance.

Blessings also require obedience, or following God's will, which is established by His word. Abiding with the Lord purifies our motives and aligns us with His will. "If you abide in Me, and My words abide in you, you will ask what you desire, and it shall be done for you" (John 15:7).

Thankfulness is also necessary. What have you done for the Kingdom with what you already have? How have you already blessed others? Many times God's blessings are not meant for you, but are given by God through you to bless others. Our own blessings often arrive as a byproduct after we are obedient. Consider barren Hannah in *I Samuel 1*, who desperately wanted to have a child. Her suffering made her completely willing to accept God's will, allowing God's blessings to flow through her. Samuel, Hannah's long-sought child, whom she dedicated as a Nazarene, was not just a blessing to her, but to all of Israel.

Finally, God's blessings are accessed by continual effort and focus. Jesus taught His followers in *Matthew 7:7, "Ask, and it will be given to you..."*. Christ's words meant to ask—continually—and to keep asking, not once or twice, but until you get an answer. God rewards those who diligently seek Him and have faith to keep looking for an answer from Heaven's throne. Keep these principles in mind and in your heart, and see how God will bless you.
