The Pastors' Spotlight

"If any of you lacks wisdom, he should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to him" (James 1:5).

You would think that all of us would have enough common sense to ask God for help when questions arise, decisions are to be made, or when circumstances have us utterly confused about life. However, it is likely that most of us try to answer questions and solve problems without consulting God. Afterwards, we tend to go to God and ask Him to bless the mess we have made. Some recent incidents illustrate how prone we are to do things without God's guidance. In a conversation with a young father, he was asked if he and his wife were involved with or attending a church. He answered, "No, with the children so busy, we thought we would wait for them to grow up and then we would find a church". We can't imagine that this decision was made with God's input. Similarly, we heard the story of a man who lost a lot of money in an investment. He later said, "I should have prayed about that first". In *Proverbs 2:9-11* we find the benefits of godly wisdom: "Then you will understand what is right and just and fair--every good path. For wisdom will enter your heart, and knowledge will be pleasant to your soul. Discretion will protect you, and understanding will guard you." In our lives we go through times when we don't want to be told what to do, how to do it, or when to do it, yet we come to realize that parents and more experienced folks were right all along and could have been a big help to us. So also in our spiritual lives, we become passionate about issues that concern us and later with more knowledge of God and reliance on His wisdom we slowly learn what is important to Him. Once we understand this, God will bless us because we have sought His will. In your prayers, ask for wisdom and direction, and then trust God for His wisdom and guidance. "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will make your paths straight" (Proverbs 3:5-6).

The Pew Perspective

This year's Vacation Bible School certainly answered a lot of questions that many people have about God and how we relate to Him. As discussed in the Pastors' Spotlight on page 1, James 1:5 should give us the confidence to seek out our Heavenly Father's input on a daily basis in the way we live and make choices. Consider the promise of I Corinthians 2:9: "Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, nor have entered into the heart of man the things which God has prepared for those who love Him". The VBS teachers appreciated the opportunity to share just a small fraction of God's love and wisdom from the Bible with the students we had. Every evening, the classes discussed a key question and found an answer in the Scriptures.

On Monday, we asked, "who am I"? From reading about the creation of Adam and Eve in *Genesis 2:4-24*, we learned that out of all the things God made in this universe, from the stars to the oceans, to the plants and animals, God considered us His crowning achievement. God created us in His image for His glory and to show us His love.

Tuesday's question was, "does God care about me"? The life story of Joseph, highlighted in *Genesis 45:1-14*, shows that the God who created us will never forget us or lose sight of His plan for our lives. Joseph, who was sold into slavery in a foreign land at an early age and endured prison time for a crime he didn't commit, was used by God to save his family and an entire country from famine. This story shows us plainly that we can trust God with our lives because He cares for us, even when we can't see the path forward.

Day three's focus was "what is God's plan for me"? The account of Zacchaeus meeting Jesus in Jericho found in *Luke 19:1-10* explained how Jesus is willing to offer anyone the gift of salvation if we will turn from our sins and follow Him in faith.

Thursday centered on the question, "how can I be like Jesus"? By reading selections from the Gospels (Luke 5:16; Luke 4:14-16; Mark 6:30-46), we learned that Jesus dedicated time to praying, worshipping and teaching in the synagogues, and providing for the needs of others. As disciples of Jesus, Christians can follow Jesus' teachings by praying to God, attending church and Bible study, and showing God's love to others through their deeds.

Our final night gave us a chance to ponder, "what do I do now"? For those who have accepted God's offer of salvation through faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior, we can lead lives that honor God. According to *Philippians 4:4-9*, God's strength and guidance will help us make good decisions and life choices.

It is a comfort to know that when we have questions, God is prepared with an answer that will meet our needs and often exceed our expectations. However, VBS comes only once a year. The doors of BBC are open every Sunday and more to share answers from God's Word to the questions and challenges we face.
