The Pew Perspective

At this time of year we as Americans commemorate the valor and sacrifice of the heroic generation who gave us independence and nationhood. These Founders include the soldiers who froze during a long winter at Valley Forge to deliver battlefield victories as much as the delegates who sweated through a hot Philadelphia summer to declare the birth of a nation conceived in liberty. Even more so than George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, or Benjamin Franklin, there is another Founding Father to whom we owe a debt of great gratitude for our freedom: Jesus Christ.

In *Hebrews 2:10*, a fascinating Greek word, *archegos*, is translated as "captain of their salvation", referring to Christ. *Archegos* cannot be adequately explained with just a single English word. It describes somebody who does something that somebody else enters into—a pioneer/trailblazer, a city founder/patriarch, and role model/hero. I found it very interesting to compare the way Jesus—our *archegos*—was like the leaders of the American Revolution (but much better).

First, Jesus is our Founding Father because He is our pioneering trailblazer. Before Him, there was no path to get to God. As Christ told Peter during His earthly ministry in *John 13:36, "Where I am going you cannot follow Me now..."*. Even as the promised Messiah, Jesus couldn't save anyone until He atoned for sin at Calvary. However, once Jesus had paid for sin, He was able to promise the repentant thief on the cross next to Him that, *"...today you will be with Me in Paradise" (Luke 23:43).* Truly Jesus is the literal "way" of *John 14:6* that gives us access to God.

Second, Jesus is our Founding Father because He is the city founder and chief cornerstone of the heavenly home where our future citizenship awaits. In response to Peter's confession of faith that Christ was the Son of the Living God in *Matthew 16:16*, Jesus proclaimed in *v. 18* that, "... on this rock I will build My church". The Apostle Paul repeated this theme in I Corinthians 3:9-11, calling Christ the foundation of God's building, made up of all believers.

Third, Jesus is our Founding Father because He is our role model and hero. We take the name of "Christian" because the term identifies us as belonging to Him and associates us with His name. We are Christians not only by external label, but as Paul explained in *Romans 8:29*, God the Father through the ministry of the Holy Spirit has made us, "...conformed to the image of His Son", so that every day we become more and more like Christ in thought, word, and deed. Fit and called for service in His Kingdom, we are Christ's "own special people" (I Peter 2:9), "kings and priests to our God" (Revelation 5:10), and "fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God" (Ephesians 2:19).

In all these ways, Jesus Christ is truly our *archegos*, the captain of our salvation. Through Jesus' death and resurrection, He blazed a trail on which He could lead us to God's love and forgiveness, rescued us from the sin that had overpowered and ensnared us, and delivered us into His Kingdom as adopted children and heirs. As much as we appreciate the heroes of the American Revolution, Jesus Christ is truly our greatest Founding Father.

Business Meeting Briefs

Report from the Monthly Business Meeting in June:


- The Church approved the Outreach Committee's motion to continue our financial support of Upper Seneca Baptist through the end of the fiscal year.
- The Church approved the Outreach Committee's motion to authorize a special missions offering in support of the Crosstrek Community Church in Urbana.
- The Church approved the Outreach Committee's motion to fund the pastors' anniversary luncheon on Jun. 26.

Expected at the July Business Meeting:

- As of press time, there were no motions ready for action by the Church at the July 2011 Business Meeting.
- Note: At the August Business Meeting, the Internal Administration Committee will present a motion to accept a \$19,354 bid to install white vinyl siding on the Church building, plus bids to buy a complete set of new shutters and make other repairs, for a grand total of \$30,500. The motion will request that an additional \$10,000 be added to the Physical Plant budget line item to cover the proposed spending plus expenses for the remainder of the year.
