# The Pastor's Spotlight

"Then Jesus came to them and said, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age'" (Matthew 28: 18-20).

In light of who Jesus is and reflecting on His instructions to the church to go and made disciples of all nations, we should take some time at the beginning of this new year and consider how we can be obedient to the Lord's first priority. Every element of our lives, because Christ lives His life through us, can be useful in helping to fulfill the Great Commission.

What can we do? First, we must pray that God's will is done. "... Your kingdom come, Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven" (Matthew 6:10). In our personal and spiritual spheres of influence the simplest acts of Christ-like behavior and love toward others can be anointed by God to accomplish His purposes. We may never know how or to what extent our small deeds have brought about God's will in someone's life.

Second, we must never forget that the Lord commissioned us to be salt and light in a world that is starving for the salt of righteousness and the light of the knowledge of God. Our every act can be consecrated as an act of service. "And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him" (Colossians 3:17).

Third, we must continue to support and pray for those who actually go to the far corners of the world to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ. "And anyone who gives even a cup of cold water to one of these little ones because he is my disciple, I tell you the truth, he will certainly not lose his reward" (Matthew 10:42).

May this new year, 2013, bring to you an abundant life that honors and brings glory to Him. Amen.

Lottie Moon goal almost met. As of press time, offerings toward BBC's \$2,200 goal are at \$1,771, or 81%, of our 2012 target. According to the SBC, every penny given to Lottie Moon is used to support Southern Baptist missionaries as they share the Gospel overseas. The offering represents 54 percent of the International Mission Board's total annual income. Thank you for your willingness to contribute to the building of God's Kingdom throughout the coming year.
