### The Pastor's Spotlight

"Thanks be to God for His indescribable gift" (II Corinthians 9:15)!

Truly, it is during the Easter Season that the Christian community should rejoice and be glad in Christ! The indescribable gift from God to mankind is the Lord Jesus Christ. Consider four facets of this most gracious gift from God: Christ died for us. Because Christ bore on His own body the punishment for our sin, we no longer have to live under the guilt and shame of sin. We have been forgiven, "...Christ died for our sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring us to God" (I Peter 3:18).

Jesus was raised to life. Because of the empty tomb we know Jesus is alive today and His promise to us is that, "...Because I live you, you also will live" (John 14:19)! Every day of this life should be lived with the great certainty of one day being in Paradise with the Lord forever.

Jesus is at the right hand of God. "The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of His being, sustaining all things by his powerful word. After He had provided purification for sins, He sat down at the right hand of the Majesty in heaven" (Hebrews 1:3). In this position of authority and power Jesus told His disciples, "All authority in heaven and earth has been given to me" (Matthew 28:18). This is the powerful One who is with us every day of our lives.

Jesus is interceding for us. One of the marvelous things about God's love is that we do not have to be perfect. We will stumble and sin against God's law of love, "...but if anybody does sin, we have one who speaks to the Father in our defense—Jesus Christ, the righteous One" (I John 2:1).

Jesus is coming back! "I will come again and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also" (John 14:3). Jesus is going to return suddenly, visibly, bodily, and with great glory. ### The Pew Perspective

Very important decisions have been made in gardens. In the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus Christ made a choice to be obedient to God's will. Contemplating the violent and humiliating death before Him, Jesus wrestled with His fear and desire for self-preservation but still made a choice that honored the Lord, saying, "... Father, if it is Your will, take this cup away from Me; nevertheless not My will, but Yours, be done" (Luke 22:42). In another garden, the opposite choice was made. At the beginning of the human race, Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden were given a choice to obey God by not doing the one thing they were told not to do, but yet they succumbed to the devil's temptation and took of the fruit from the tree of knowledge of good and evil. Like an infection, the consequences of Adam and Eve's sin have rippled through the DNA of all their descendants, birthing them in a state of sin and defiance against God for generations. Paul summarized humanity's fatal condition, saying, "Therefore, just as through one man sin entered the world, and death through sin, and thus death spread to all men, because all sinned" (Romans 5:12).

It was into this situation where mankind was separated from the God who created them that a Savior was sent as a man to rescue them. In an act of divine symmetry, God sent a second Adam to undo the damage the first Adam caused. Paul explained to the Corinthian church, "For since by man came death, by Man also came the resurrection of the dead. For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ all shall be made alive" (I Corinthians 15:21-22). Jesus' deliberate obedience to God's will that He sacrifice His life when He was guilty of no crime reversed Adam's deliberate disobedience to heed God's commandment in Eden.

Perhaps some may ask, are we back to "zero", Jesus' obedience and righteousness cancelling out Adam's disobedience and sin? The joy-giving answer is that Jesus' obedience and righteousness did much, much more than merely zero out Adam's sin debt. Romans 5:20 tells us "...where sin abounded, grace abounded much more...". Christ's death and resurrection didn't just free us from spiritual jail, it endowed us with a heavenly inheritance. Our relationship with God, transformed by Christ's redemption, didn't just go from negative to neutral, but instead like a fuel gauge went all the way past "full". Peter told Christians they could expect, based on their faith in the resurrection of Jesus Christ, "...an inheritance incorruptible and undefiled and that does not fade away, reserved in heaven for you..." (I Peter 1:4).

As we again come to our annual remembrance of Christ's death, burial, and resurrection, we too have a decision to make. We can, like Christ in Gethsemane, choose to follow God's will and receive His love, forgiveness, and purpose in life. Or, like Adam in Eden, we can choose to follow our own selfish desires that lead to alienation, destruction, and regret. This year, what path will you choose? Whose will will be done in your life?

# Interview with the Baptist Men's Day Speaker

- ★ How did you first hear about BBC? I became friends in seminary with Randy Gilliam, who invited me to visit BBC. I felt very comfortable and at home with the people of Barnesville. I continue to pray for you all.
- ★ Where are you currently serving? I am involved in the bus ministry with Beacon Baptist in White Marsh, MD as well as helping at a homeless shelter run by Breath of Life Baptist Church in Aberdeen, MD, where I help with devotions, counseling, and providing clothing for the poor. My wife Cindy is a partner in ministry.
- \* How did you know you were called into the ministry? After co-owning a trucking company for 15 years, God called me to leave and go into the ministry--go now or not at all. I signed up for classes with Southern Baptist Theological Seminary even though I didn't even have a GED. In my first seminary class on theology, I was intimidated by the big words used and didn't plan to return for the second class. However, the professor stopped me after class and offered to help me get through his class, even though he didn't know me or my situation.
- ★ What is the most important thing you have learned or experienced in your ministry? To be grateful for the privilege to teach His Word and to be a shepherd.
- ★ What is your best memory of BBC? I was preaching a revival at BBC. One day when I arrived at the church, I saw a fire truck with the hose in the church, filling the baptistry. I told the firemen to run the siren next time they came to fill the baptistry as a sign that someone got saved at BBC!
- ★ Any final thoughts? Thank you for loving and embracing Cindy and I. Keep your loving feeling foremost.

She will speak three times, twice from 7:00 to 8:00 pm on Friday, Mar. 8 and Saturday, Mar. 9 and also during the Sunday morning worship service on the 10<sup>th</sup>. Gayla speaks with the heart of a missionary and with passion for the Gospel and for people.
