The Pastor's Spotlight

"But Jesus immediately said to them; 'Take courage! It is I. Don't be afraid'" (Matthew 14:27).

What wonderful words to hear from the Lord when His disciples are in distress or in trouble or are afraid. The context of this Scripture was that Jesus' disciples were in a boat on the Sea of Galilee. The wind was contrary, they had rowed for a long time but had not gone too far, and the boat was buffeted by the waves. Jesus had been on the mountain praying most of the night and knew of their trouble. He came toward them walking on the water. Because they did not expect to see the Lord, or anyone else walking on the water, they were afraid and thought they were seeing a ghost. But Jesus said to them, "Take courage. It is I. Don't be afraid". A direct translation of how Jesus identified Himself is, "I AM". This is the same way Jehovah God identified Himself to Moses in *Exodus 3:14*. By using this descriptor Jesus was clearly identifying Himself as God in the flesh. Furthermore, by walking on the water, Jesus demonstrated His creation power over nature. His disciples then had nothing to fear and could be encouraged because Jesus was with them. The Scripture goes on to say that when Jesus got into the boat, the wind died down and the disciples in the boat worshipped Him, saying, "Truly You are the Son of God" (Matthew 14:33).

Just as Jesus was on the mountain praying for His disciples in their predicament, even today Jesus is at the right hand of God the Father interceding for those who trust in him (*Romans 8:34*). There is no circumstance, no storm, no distress in a believer's life that Jesus is not aware of. When a believer learns to trust Christ and remembers who Jesus is and what He has done for His disciples, and that He promised to be with His followers to the end of the age, then that believer can be of good courage and need not be afraid because he or she is in the loving care of the great I AM.

The Pew Perspective

Over the Memorial Day weekend I went on a family fishing trip to Smith Mountain Lake near Roanoke, VA. Our usual quarry is rockfish, also called striped bass or stripers. Smith Mountain Lake, however, has many species of fish, including both large- and smallmouth bass, catfish, crappies, and muskies. We hire a fishing guide who knows the lake and provides the boat and tackle. Stripers are an aggressive fish that have a distinctive way of attacking its prev/live bait and put up a fight when hooked. Even though we try to fish exclusively for stripers, we still catch bass and catfish from time to time. It is hard to determine exactly what type of fish we have caught until it is just a few feet away from the boat, but we can usually tell whether we've caught a striper or another species by the way the hook is set and how the fish fights on the line. Our fishing guide, a striper-lover at heart, gets upset if we catch any non-striper species and can't wait to toss a catfish or bass off his boat if we happen to land one.

This fishing tale reminds me of the biblical parable about the wheat and tares in Matthew 13:24-30 and Jesus' teaching about knowing a tree by its fruit in Luke 6:43-45. In Matthew 13, tares are an unwelcome weed that look similar to wheat when young but are otherwise unedible and unprofitable. Only at harvest time can the wheat and tare be safely separated without harming the stalks of wheat. In Luke 6, Jesus makes the point that a "tree is known by its fruit" (v. 4). Just as wheat and tares grow side by side and grapes don't come from thorn bushes, so it is with fish. They live together in close proximity, but can be told apart by their behavior. A catfish is slow and gentle when caught, making you think that maybe there is nothing on the hook at all. It would be very unusual for a catfish to generate the kind of power that a muscular striper would demonstrate in its attempt to charge the bait and drag it away.

As Christians, these anecdotes, be they biblical parables about agricultural products or my recent story about fishing, should help us remember that we are recognized by our actions, and our actions are determined by our nature. Followers of Jesus Christ should stand out from the world as bearers of salt and light because we have died to our old way of thinking and behaving and now have the new birth inside of us charting our actions and priorities (*Romans 6:4-11*). A grapevine bears forth grapes because that is the only fruit it knows how to produce, and a striper pulls down hard on a baited hook because it doesn't know any other way to catch its prey. When we act in accordance with our God-given nature, the Lord is pleased, bringing the wheat into His barn but bundling the tares for fire and destruction (*Matthew 13:30*).

Through the power and guidance of the Holy Spirit, let us always try to behave and live in such a way that no one is ever confused about whether we are Christians or needs to examine us up close to realize that we belong to Jesus Christ.

Report from the Monthly Business Meeting in May:


