The Pastors' Spotlight

"Trust in the Lord and do good; dwell in the land, and feed on His faithfulness. Delight yourself also in the Lord, and He shall give you the desires of your heart. Commit your way to the Lord, trust also in Him and He shall bring it to pass" (Psalm 37:3-5).

February is a good month to read the *Psalms*. It is a hard winter month, football is over, it's cold, the daylight hours are still short, and the only break is Presidents' Day. Folks suffer from SAD and look forward to spring. In the midst of this winter malaise the *Psalms* speak to our hearts about God's faithfulness, care, holiness, and majesty, about praise and worship due Him, and His mighty power as our rock, fortress, and defender. The *Psalms* help us to express our joy in Him and they lift our hearts to Him in adoration, thankfulness, and awe. They help us to verbalize our remorse for sin, our joy in forgiveness, and assure us of God's personal involvement with His people. "Bless the Lord, O my soul; and all that is within me, bless His holy name" (Psalm 103:1)!

We also find in the *Psalms* God's wise counsel to help our lives bring glory, honor, and praise to Him. Consider these three things from Psalm 37: trust in, delight in, and commit your way to the Lord. If we learn to trust the Lord's goodness, we live with the certainty that He can lead us through every situation life confronts us with and bring us out of each circumstance in victory. As we confidently trust in the Lord, we delight to be in His presence. This gladness is Jesus' own joy fulfilled in those who follow Him (John 17:13). When we trust the Lord, feed on His faithfulness, delight in His presence, and know the joy of His love, then we are compelled to commit our lives into His hands. He will cause His perfect will for our lives to be accomplished for our good and His glory. "Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in thy sight, O Lord, my strength and my Redeemer" (Psalm 19:14). Thank the Lord for February!

The Pew Perspective

Barnesville Baptist celebrates communion, or the Lord's supper, on the first Sunday of every month. One of the key verses that is often used in the communion observance is Luke 22:20, which details Jesus' words during the Passover dinner He observed with His disciples we know as the Last Supper. It reads, "Likewise He also took the cup after supper, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in My blood, which is shed for you". With these words, Jesus linked His new ordinance for Christians with the new covenant promised by God in Jeremiah 31:31-34: "I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah... I will put Mv law in their minds, and write it on their hearts: and I will be their God, and they shall be My people...For I will forgive their iniquity, and their sin I will remember no *more*". As adopted heirs (Ephesians 1:5), we today are beneficiaries of the new covenant, based not on the system of animal sacrifices to atone for sins, but on the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ which grants forgiveness of sins and eternal life through faith.

The old covenant system required continual sacrifices for continuing sins. The new covenant God promised in Jeremiah 31 did more, and better, than just addressing the sinful behavior of sinful men. The Law, God's holy standard, never changed, but instead of engraving rules on stone tablets. God imprinted a desire to love, obey, and worship Him on the hearts of men who trusted the Lord through faith. This was possible because those who trusted Christ's grace were born again with a new identity, a new nature, that transformed sinners into saints, empowered by the Holy Spirit to live lives pleasing to God. Even though the new covenant still required sacrifice to atone for sin, instead of animals, a superior and permanent sacrifice was offered to not just cover over, but forgive and remove sins for all time: Jesus Christ. His sinless and divine nature, His obedience unto death, and His resurrection from the dead allowed a holy God to justly forgive the sins of those who asked in faith for Christ to be their substitute.

The book of *Hebrews* explains that Christ served as a better high priest and a better sacrifice than what the Old Testament Levites could offer, making what was ceremonial, real, what was limited, abounding, and what was temporary, permanent. "And for this reason He is the Mediator of the new covenant, by means of death, for the redemption of the transgressions under the first covenant, that those who are called may receive the promise of the eternal inheritance" (Hebrews 9:15). Instead of relying on priests hidden behind curtains, through Jesus Christ we enjoy direct and permanent access to God. As our great High Priest, Jesus forever intercedes before the Father on our behalf, ministering our praise and thanksgiving as well as our prayers.

Jesus' disciples may not have understood all the deep and rich meaning of Christ's words at the Last Supper, but how marvelous, how wonderful it is that Jesus did shed His blood so we could have a new relationship—a better communion—with our Creator.
