#### The Pew Perspective

Where were you on Jun. 17, 2001? For most people reading these words, they weren't at BBC. Our church was much smaller back then. We had been without a pastor for almost a year by the summer of 2001. We had fewer people in the pews, not so many fellowships and activities, less giving, a smaller budget, infrequent baptisms, and barely any new members joining—all the indicators that you might think of to gage the vitality of a congregation. But those that were sitting in the pews on that Sunday morning 14 years ago will remember it as the first day that Pastor Randy Gilliam and his wife Sandy began serving our congregation. The average pastorate lasts 3.6 years, but we have been blessed to keep the same shepherd four times longer than most churches.

A long pastorate is actually recommended in the Scripture. The Apostle Paul, writing to his protégé Timothy, urged him to "...remain in Ephesus so that you may instruct..." (I Timothy 1:3). The Greek word for "remain" includes the idea of being constant and persevering. A pastor must at times endure disappointment, persecution, crises, and spiritual warfare. Timothy was faced with a group of false teachers, but instead of being discouraged and moving on to a bigger and better church, he stayed and taught people the truth of the Gospel and how to live more like Christ.

A pastor has a great opportunity to lead people toward salvation through faith in Christ, and then nurture those new believers toward spiritual maturity. "...the goal of our instruction is love that comes from a pure heart, a good conscience, and a sincere faith" (I Timothy 1:5). But those things require time: time to become familiar with people and their lives, time to develop relationships, time to earn trust and respect, and time to guide, exhort, correct, and encourage. Barnesville Baptist has been blessed by God with a pastor and pastor's wife who have done all those things, so to Randy & Sandy, let me, on behalf of the congregation, thank you especially for three things:

Thank you for staying so long. If we were an average church, we would have had to stop and start four times over the last 14 years instead of maintaining our momentum in fellowship, teaching, worship, ministry, and evangelism.

Thank you for stepping up when you could have stepped back. When our congregation needed continuity and a familiar face the most, you stayed on, carried burdens you didn't ask for, and walked through the storm with us.

Thank you for setting us up for the future. When we sent you off to weekend seminary classes, we just expected you to learn some Greek and Hebrew, but you also brought back a friend whom we have also grown to love and trust as a shepherd.

In the last 14 years, our pews have filled with new faces, we regularly fellowship and participate in activities both inside and outside the church walls, our giving toward Kingdom work has outpaced that of much larger churches, and the baptistery is filled with water and new believers much more often. I suspect that come Aug. 30, 2015, most people will say, when asked where they were, that they were at BBC.
