The Pew Perspective

There is some great theology in Christmas carols. One of those memorable verses with deep truth is found in Charles Wesley's "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing", where Jesus' incarnation is described in rhyme: *Mild He lay His glory by, born that man no more may die, Born to raise the sons of earth, born to give them second birth.* Jesus came to this earth with a mission to save souls. But how did Jesus' birth in Bethlehem so many centuries ago free those sons of earth from spiritual death and give them a second birth? It has to do with baptism.

The water baptism that we observe in our baptistery may be symbolic, but it reflects a real spiritual baptism that occurs when we receive God's salvation through faith. That baptism of justification and sanctification transforms, immerses, and fuses us into Christ. The Apostle Paul explained this in *Romans 6:3-4: "…As many of us as were baptized into* Christ Jesus were baptized into His death...Therefore we were buried with Him through baptism into death, that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life". Through some amazing, incomprehensible act of God, we get to share in Christ's death and partake in His resurrection. Our old, sinful nature is replaced with a new nature and identity in Jesus Christ, just like salt poured into water. The grains are immediately gone, dissolved into the water. Instead of sinking to the bottom, they are transformed into something new: not just wet salt, but salt water.

In addition to a new nature, those who are baptized into Christ Jesus are freed from the penalty and power of sin. *Romans 6:7* tells us that *"For he who has died has been freed from sin"*. Just like a prisoner is released from his sentence at death, a newborn Christian is dead to his old way of living. We don't have to live like we used to. Sin is no longer in charge of us.

Closely following our death to our old nature is our birth into a new life full of abilities, opportunities, and potential. Paul described this new destiny to the Christians of Rome, writing, "...reckon yourselves to be dead indeed to sin, but alive to God in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 6:11). When we receive Jesus as Lord and Savior, He doesn't just forgive our sins and then wish us luck. He has an amazing future of love, blessings, and purpose in store for His children.

Our new birth is linked to Jesus' death in the same way that Christmas only matters because of Easter. "...Christ...loved the Church and gave Himself for her, that He might sanctify and cleanse her with the washing of water by the Word, that He might present her to Himself a glorious Church..." (Ephesians 5:25-27). Our Savior set aside His glorious existence in Heaven to reverse our curse. He was our second Adam, obedient and trusting God unlike our forebearer, who chose disobedience and doubt. Just as we inherited Adam's nature at birth, we can inherit Christ's nature at our second birth. What a Savior we have! How else can we respond but by saying: Glory to the newborn King?

Business Meeting Briefs

Report from the Monthly Business Meeting in November:

- A motion from the Internal Administration Cmte. to increase the Benevolence budget line item by \$1,000 was approved.
- The Internal Administration Cmte. offered a bylaw to allow a portion of the security deposit for non-members' weddings to be given to the church custodian, which was adopted.
- The membership application of Justin Yates, based on his profession of faith and baptism on Nov. 1, was approved.
- A motion to give \$50 to the International Student Ministry of Ocean City Baptist Church was passed.

Report from the Special Business Meeting on Nov. 22:

• The Church ratified four amendments to the Church Constitution to improve and clarify procedures related to admitting and dismissing members, applying the Church's views of faith and practice, and defining deacon tenure and service.

Expected at the December Business Meeting:

• The Finance Committee will offer a motion to approve its recommended 2016 Church budget. The proposed budget amount of \$209,881 is \$17,500 less than the 2015 adjusted budget amount of \$233,616, which to date includes over \$6,235 in Cooperative Program giving beyond the minimum budgeted amount of \$10,000.

For the Record:

- At the October 2015 business meeting, the electrical budget line item was increased to \$1,500.
- The membership applications of Sam & Robin Berry, each coming by statement, were approved at the October 2015 business meeting.

News You Can Use Constitutional amendments approved. During a special business meeting on Sunday, Nov. 22, the Church approved four

amendments to the Church Constitution. Fifty adult members were present for the meeting and ratified all the changes unanimously. The amendments will improve and clarify our procedures related to admitting and dismissing members, applying the Church's views of faith and practice, and defining deacon tenure and service.

for seniors during Children's Church and handed them out on Sunday, Nov. 22.

Christmas services planned. BBC has several special events scheduled to celebrate Christmas. The Bell Choir will start the season off with a performance on Sunday, Dec. 13. The Choir will present its cantata, "Breath of Heaven", during worship on Sunday, Dec. 20. Based on the reflective Christmas song by Amy Grant, the "Breath of Heaven" cantata will give a fresh perspective of Christmas by taking a closer look at the compassionate heart of Mary. Paul Foster will direct. Lee Michael and Jan Burdette will narrate as Joseph & Mary. The service will close with the Baptist Men giving gifts to the children present. After the service, the parsonage open house will be held from 12:30 pm to 3:00 pm, when we will reconvene in the sanctuary for the annual Christmas hymn sing. A Christmas Eve service will be held at 7:00 pm on the 24th.


churches among unreached peoples and places for the glory of God. The national goal is \$175 million;
