The Pew Perspective

Everyone knows the story of Jonah and the whale (really, a large fish): how Jonah was fleeing from God until he was thrown overboard from a ship and swallowed up for three days and nights. Less familiar is what happened before and after that aquatic adventure. The book of *Jonah* is really a strong testimony about God's salvation and grace.

Jonah should help us remember that God's purpose of salvation for all people is not just a New Testament idea. While the Old Testament does teach that the Jews are God's chosen people, they were not chosen to hoard God's love and blessings. Instead, the Jewish nation was called to preach about Him to the world. Unfortunately, much of the Old Testament documents God's judgment on His chosen people for their disobedience and failure to serve as His witnesses to the nations. When Jonah was called to preach to Nineveh in the eighth century B.C., Nineveh was the capital of the Assyrian Empire and the largest city in the world, with an estimated population of 600,000. God cared about the people of Nineveh as much as He cared about those in Jerusalem, so He sent His prophet Jonah to preach to them. "Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and cry out against it; for their wickedness has come up before Me" (Jonah 1:2). Nineveh was an evil and pagan city, but it responded to Jonah's preaching and repented of its sins, saving an entire generation from God's righteous judgment.

Jonah should also help us remember that God gives grace in proportion to how much we need it, not how much we deserve it. Nineveh was an enemy of Israel, explaining Jonah's refusal to preach to them and his foolhardy attempt to flee from God. Jonah desired Nineveh's judgment and destruction, but he knew God's character. "...I know that You are a gracious and merciful God, slow to anger and abundant in lovingkindness, One who relents from doing harm" (Jonah 4:2). The Lord's desire is to save and redeem lives, not to destroy people and cast them away. We can see this vividly in the life of the Apostle Paul. In I Timothy 1:13-14, Paul recalled his past as a Pharisee who put Christians in iail, scattered the Church, and supported the stoning of Stephen. "...I was formerly a blasphemer, a persecutor, and an insolent man; but I obtained mercy because I did it ignorantly in unbelief. And the grace of our Lord was exceedingly abundant, with faith and love which are in Christ Jesus". God could have struck Paul down for his many sins, but he instead received the Lord's forgiveness and a new life. We as Christians today think of the Apostle Paul as a great Christian leader and missionary, but he started out as one of Christianity's greatest enemies. In the same way, the people of Nineveh were God's enemies, but He had pity on them (Jonah 4:11). The Ninevites had done nothing to deserve God's favor, but they desperately needed it. Upon hearing Jonah, the entire city repented, with their king leading the way: "...let man and beast be covered with sackcloth, and cry mightily to God; yes, let every one turn from his evil way and from the violence that is in his hands" (Jonah 3:8).

Let us thank our Heavenly Father that He has also extended His salvation and grace to us through His Son Jesus Christ. We need God's love just as much as the Ninevites did.




