The Pastor's Spotlight

Summer is a very busy and exciting time of year. Schools are closed, vacations are planned, and gardens are (over-) producing tomatoes, zucchini, and all sorts of fresh fruits and vegetables. Out of all the summertime fun that you can have, there is one event that is truly even more exciting and rewarding than cookouts, swimming, camping, hiking, or fishing, and that is Vacation Bible School (VBS). There is no greater ministry outreach to our local community that can we do as a church family than VBS. I believe VBS is one of the most effective ways to share the great news of the Gospel with our friends, family members, and neighbors. Remember, Jesus gave us the Great Commission command to "...go and make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19).

Our underwater-themed VBS is called "Submerged", based on Psalm 139:23-34: "Search me, God, and know my heart; test me and know my concerns. See if there is any offensive way in me; lead me in the everlasting way". Over the course of the five nights, the children will learn how Jesus encountered all types of people--a tax collector, a Samaritan woman, a Pharisee, a blind man, and small children--that many people might have rejected or found unimportant. In each case, Jesus saw past surface issues and looked deeper, into their hearts, sharing with them His everlasting love that changed their lives forever. The same life-changing encounter that those men, women, and children experienced with Jesus is available to people today, and the Lord is giving us the privilege this Jul. 11-15 to be a part of His Kingdom work.

So won't you pray for God's blessings on our VBS week and then come and take part in this year's VBS? Invite your family, friends and neighbors to come and see firsthand the Gospel in action. Remember, Jesus commanded us to go, so come, and bring someone with you! My prayer is that we will be found faithful to His command to share God's love with everyone we can! See you all at VBS!

The Pew Perspective

On June 28, 1787, the Constitutional Convention meeting in Philadelphia was in gridlock. Representatives from large states and small states were opposed to each other on many issues. Into the fray stepped Benjamin Franklin. While not a born-again Christian, Franklin believed in God and His providential care for the new American nation. He, like many Founding Fathers and most Americans in that era, was also very familiar with the Bible, and quoted from both the Old and New Testaments in recommending prayer for the Lord's guidance in drafting a new form of government the same way Americans requested God's favor during the perilous years of revolution. Quoting Psalm 127:1: "Unless the Lord builds the house, they labor in vain who build it..." and Matthew 10:29: "Are not two sparrows sold for a copper coin? And not one of them falls to the ground apart from your Father's will", Franklin asked "...if a sparrow cannot fall to the ground without His notice, is it probable that an empire can rise without His aid"? As we celebrate our country's independence this July 4th, we can also take a cue from Dr. Franklin and recall that the Bible is a source of wisdom for any undertaking, be it living a life pleasing to God or creating a society that promotes life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. Consider the Constitution's goals, found in its preamble, and how biblical truths underpin all of them.

- * We the people of the United States: "... select from all the people able men, such as fear God, men of truth, hating covetousness; and place such over them to be rulers...." (Exodus 18:21).
- * in order to form a more perfect union: "...Every kingdom divided against itself is brought to desolation, and every city or house divided against itself will not stand" (Matthew 12:25).
- * establish justice: "You shall do no injustice in judgment. You shall not be partial to the poor, nor honor the person of the mighty. In righteousness you shall judge your neighbor" (Leviticus 19:15).
- * insure domestic tranquility: "Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity" (Psalm 133:1)!
- * provide for the common defense: "For by wise counsel you will wage your own war, and in a multitude of counselors there is safety" (Proverbs 24:6).
- * promote the general welfare: "When the righteous are in authority, the people rejoice; but when a wicked man rules, the people groan" (Proverbs 29:2).
- * secure the blessings of liberty to ourselves and our posterity: "...proclaim liberty throughout all the land unto all the inhabitants thereof..." (Leviticus 25:10).
- * do ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America: "Let every soul be subject to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and the authorities that exist are appointed by God" (Romans 13:1).

Our country needs biblical wisdom and Christian witness just as much as it did in Franklin's day, be it in the voting booth, the jury box, or even the foxhole. This Independence Day, won't you consider how you can serve our nation?

Business Meeting Briefs


Report from the Monthly Business Meeting in June:

Disaster response. In response to the Jun. 23 flash floods that caused great damage and loss of life in southern West Virginia, BBC is collecting emergency relief supplies and donations to support the victims. Items requested include: nonperishable food items, bottled water, new or lightly worn clothing including underwear and socks, diapers and baby wipes, toiletries including feminine products, pet care products and food, washcloths and towels, first aid kits and hand sanitizer, garbage bags and cleaning supplies including rubber gloves, laundry detergent, flashlights and batteries, and blankets and pillows. Supplies can be brought to church until 9:00 am, Saturday, Jul. 9. Donations can be made out to BBC; we will send a check to our local Baptist relief agencies responding to the WV floods.
