The Pew Perspective

Have you ever enjoyed being called peculiar? Normally, calling someone peculiar is an indirect way of saying he or she is weird, but in the Bible being called peculiar is a badge of honor. The Apostle Peter explained to Christians that unlike unbelievers who reject the Gospel, we stand out by having received the high calling of serving God's Kingdom. In the New King James Version, I Peter 2:9 reads: "But you are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, *His own special people, that you may proclaim the* praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light...". Some other versions translate the underlined phrase above as "God's possession", but the old King James Version says we're just "peculiar". As Christians, we are distinct from the world around us, having been and even now being transformed by God's grace into the likeness of Christ.

At our April breakfast meeting, the Baptist Men had a discussion about what makes Barnesville Baptist peculiar in its own right, focusing on BBC's "distinctives": the spiritual qualities and ministry priorities that makes our congregation the church that it is and what visitors find unique and exceptional about us. While all Christians and all congregations have received the same Great Commission calling, the men came up with a list of 10 characteristics we feel BBC excel at, set us apart from others, and are worthy of handing down to next generation of Barnesville Baptists.

The following list the men around the table came up with that morning is neither official nor even complete, but the discussion around these themes was very instructive. Therefore, I plan to devote time in this space over the coming months to expand on them: unity (moving forward together), leadership (setting a good example), missions (supporting and sending those who share the Gospel), a high view of Scripture (the truth and importance of the Gospel), church building (smaller size means we're volunteer-powered and worship together), prayer (direct link to God that works), outreach (welcoming and caring spirit), hymns (deep theology in accessible songs), tithing (financially secure and able to help others), and family fellowship (living life together).

So what do you think are the best qualities of Barnesville Baptist? Did the men get them all, or are there other spiritual priorities that we should emphasize to our children and teach to new members? The next time people call you peculiar, thank them for noticing and take pride in your status as one of God's children.
