The Pew Perspective

Prayer is a key part of Barnesville Baptist's identity, so it is our sixth "BBC distinctive". We pray a lot. We pray to open and close the Sunday morning worship service. We pray before the offering and before the sermon. We pray over the children after their story time. We take prayer requests from the congregation for both concerns and praises before praying together. We pray before meals and meetings. We send out emails and Facebook posts so that we can pray for each other throughout the week. We come together on Wednesday nights for prayer meeting. The pastor prays before he preaches, the deacons pray before they serve, and Sunday School teachers pray before they teach. Why do we do so much praying? Let me offer a few reasons:

First, prayer is not optional for followers of Christ. In Matthew 5:6-7, Jesus instructed His disciples about prayer for three verses in a row with the words "...when you pray", not "if you pray". Prayer is how we communicate with the Lord, so it is impossible to have a relationship with Him without prayer.

Second, prayer is important to God. The Lord finds it so valuable that He assists us to pray. Paul explained that "...we do not know what we should pray for as we ought, but the Spirit Himself makes intercession for us..." (Romans 8:26).

Third, one of the core reasons the church exists is so that we can pray together. We can see in Acts 1 and 2 that the church was formed when the first Christians were together in one place in in one accord. One of the key roles of the early church in Jerusalem was that they "...continued steadfastly in...prayers" (Acts 2:42).

Fourth, prayer gives us the power to minister. From an earthly perspective, the early church was small, weak, and unpopular. But they were able to reach many for Christ with the message of the Gospel despite opposition and persecution because they were empowered to do mighty things through prayer. "And when they had prayed, the place where they were assembled together was shaken; and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and they spoke the word of God with boldness" (Acts 4:31).

Fifth, prayer reaches beyond us. God works in amazing ways when His people pray. We may not be able to heal the sick, support the poor, or console the hurting and suffering around the world, but our prayers can reach far beyond our physical abilities. Paul told the Corinthian church that even though they were not together, their prayers blessed him. "...You also helping together in prayer for us, that thanks may be given by many persons on our behalf..." (II Corinthians 1:11).

Sixth, prayer unifies and protects us as a congregation. "...In everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus" (Philippians 4:6). When we pray together, our hearts and spirits synchronize. We become closer to each other as we become closer to God and His will for us as individuals, families, and a church. When we grow together in prayer, our ability to love others, share the gospel, and defend ourselves from spiritual opposition all increase.

For all these reasons and more, prayer is a vital piece of our BBC identity that gives us purpose, power, and protection.

Report from the 146th Annual Business Meeting in October:

- Lisa Fedders was elected to serve on the Outreach Cmte. for the remainder of the 2016-2018 term for the Cards Ministry, vice Jane Fowler, deceased, as was Tina Appleton to serve on the Worship Cmte. for the remainder of the 2016-2018 term.
- The Outreach Cmte. motions to increase spending authority for the Outreach budget line item (BLI) by \$1,200 and to pay for the meals of children 16 and under at the Dec. 10 Christmas dinner were approved.
- The Education Cmte. motion to increase spending authority for the Youth BLI by \$500 passed.
- The Internal Administration Cmte. motion to increase spending authority for the Physical Plant BLI by \$13,000 passed.
- A resolution to begin the annual budget process for 2018 was adopted; the standing committees will report to the Treasurer by Nov. 5.
- The Church approved the membership applications of Roy Leibrand, by statement; and Maggie, Hannah, and Elsie Leibrand, each by profession of faith and baptism on Sep. 10.
