

## The Pew Perspective

It's been a few months since we last discussed BBC's distinctives—the spiritual qualities and ministry priorities that make BBC what it is--so it's time to continue our top 10 list with #7: outreach. Chances are that before you experienced BBC's worship style or learned about our doctrinal beliefs you encountered our efforts to reach out to friends, relatives, and the local community with kindness and service in Christ's name. Jesus taught His disciples that salt without flavor is useless. No one will know how salty we are if we stay in our saltshaker, so we have to leave our nice, warm sanctuary and engage people where they are. "Nor do they light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a lampstand, and it gives light to all who are in the house" (Matthew 5:15). For those who aren't Christians, receiving an invitation to a church barbecue at a park is a much more comfortable introduction to Christians and Christianity than having to enter a sanctuary and be expected to sing in public. That's why we emphasize activities like Vacation Bible School and youth havrides. When people see that we are friendly and open and that their children are having fun, we will have openings to share the Gospel and invite them to Sunday School and worship services.

Communication is also a key part of BBC's outreach. With today's technology, people can listen to a past Sunday's sermon, watch a bell choir performance, read this newsletter, and send us a message from anywhere. Email, our church website, and our Facebook page are great tools for people to learn about Barnesville Baptist. We know that people driving past our church are reading our marquee sign because we have received emails and calls from complete strangers in response. But nothing can top personal relationships. "By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 13:35). Visiting shut-ins and those who are in the hospital, picking up the phone, or sending a handwritten card lets people know we care enough to take the time to seek them out. Such efforts don't go unnoticed by the families and friends of the elderly, the sick, and the bereaved.

Outreach is also practical, addressing real needs. When people are in need or in pain, there is no comparison between telling them that God loves them and showing them that God loves them. James, the brother of Jesus, asked in his epistle: "If a brother or sister is naked and destitute of daily food, and one of you says to them, 'Depart in peace, be warmed and filled,' but you do not give them the things which are needed for the body, what does it profit" (James 2:15-16)? That is why our Food Ministry has become such an important part of our outreach. Each week dozens of people come by for free groceries and stick around to ask for prayer, spiritual guidance, and copies of God's Word.

I am certain that one of the reasons why God has blessed us as a church family is that we have a heart for outreach and service. Let us continue to seek out new ways to show the Lord's timeless love and grace to a lost and dark world full of hurting people. They will respond to Him if we remain faithful to His Word and His work. "And I, if I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all peoples to Myself" (John 12:32).

#### **Business Meeting Briefs**

Report from the Monthly Business Meeting in January:

- The Treasurer submitted his Annual Report on the 2017 fiscal year.
- The Pastor appointed the Deacons to serve on the Select Committee on Auditing, which will review the 2017 finances and report at the March Business Meeting.
- An Internal Administration Cmte, motion to create a Minivan Restricted Fund for the purpose of receiving restricted receipts to pay down the principal for the 2017 Chrysler Pacifica minivan was adopted.
- The Church approved the nominations of Danny & Cindy Moore and Lee Michael to serve as messengers to the 2018 Southern Baptist Convention being held in Dallas, TX on Jun. 12-13.

*Expected at the February Business Meeting:* 

The Outreach Cmte. will offer a motion to modify the Cooperative Program budget line item (BLI) from the greater of \$10,000 or 10% of regular receipts to the greater of \$10,000 or 8% of regular receipts; (B) modify the Montgomery Baptist Association BLI from \$6,000 to the greater of \$10,000 or 5% of regular receipts; and (C) create a Minimum Missions Offerings BLI of \$2,000 under the Outreach Cmte., half designated for the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering in April 2018, and half for the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering in December 2018.
