

## The Pew Perspective

Do you know what the Great Commission is? During the WMU report at the Southern Baptist Convention in Dallas, TX in June, it was reported that more than half (51%) of churchgoers had never even heard of the Great Commission, and only 17% knew what the term meant. I was guite shocked to hear those statistics, and my suspicion is that all those people must attend other churches. But just in case, this article will ensure that 100% of Barnesville Baptist is familiar with the Great Commission, for it is our marching orders as Jesus' followers to spread His Gospel until He comes back for

The Great Commission is found in Matthew 28:18-20, the last words of that book. Matthew 28 begins with Jesus' resurrection and it is in that context of victory over death, hell, and sin that Jesus tells His disciples that "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth" (v. 18). Jesus Christ the suffering servant who was crucified is now the risen and glorified King, so Christians are fully empowered to do His will. And His will is that we go and make disciples of all the nations. In other words, we are charged to share the good news of the Gospel with everyone, everywhere, all the time. You don't have to be a full-time overseas missionary to do your part in the Great Commission. We can share with family, friends, and neighbors in our immediate surroundings, in our workplaces and schools. We do not lack for people near us to share with. More than a million people live in Montgomery County and more than six million live in Maryland, most of whom do not know Jesus as their Lord and Savior. "Behold, I say to you, lift up your eyes and look at the fields, for they are already white for harvest" (John 4:35)! That is why we have a Food Ministry and VBS, so we can minister and share at home. We can also send and support missionaries with our prayers and offerings, which the Apostle Paul called a "sweet-smelling aroma, an acceptable sacrifice, well pleasing to God" (Philippians 4:18). That is why we support the Cooperative Program, the Montgomery Baptist Association and the BCM/D, the Lottie Moon and Annie Armstrong Offerings, as well as missionaries and church planters with whom we have partnered.

Leading people to faith in Christ is just the beginning. Baptizing them as the first step of obedience is followed by teaching them to walk with the Lord: Bible study, prayer, worship, service, and fellowship are all necessary elements for a new believer to gain spiritual maturity and increase in Christ-likeness so that they too can step up and become active contributors in the Great Commission.

Jesus offered a final encouragement and reminder in the Great Commission: "and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age" (v. 20). The active and present Head of the Church is Jesus Christ (Colossians 1:18) and He has promised that He will never leave us nor forsake us (Hebrews 13:5). If even two or three are gathered together our Lord is with us (Matthew 18:20) and He has sent His Holy Spirit to comfort and guide us (John 14:16). When it comes to fulfilling the Great Commission, we are fully authorized, certified, and empowered to complete all that our Savior has called us to do when we are centered in His will and grounded in His truth.

## **Business Meeting Briefs**

Report from the Monthly Business Meeting in June:

- A motion to transfer \$1,600 from the Outreach Cmte.'s Missions Support BLI to the Internal Administration Cmte.'s Official Vehicles BLI passed.
- The Church approved a Worship Cmte. motion to exceed the Music budget line item by \$1,315 for the purpose of accepting the quote from Malmark Bellcraftsmen of Plumsteadville, PA to refurbish the church's hand bell set, not to exceed \$1,315.
- The Internal Administration Cmte. motion to adopt a by-law to define the procedures for virtual standing committee meetings was adopted.
- A motion to dismiss an inactive member from church membership upon his request was approved.
- A motion to move the July Business meeting to Jun. 27 so as not to conflict with Independence Day was passed.

*Expected at the July Business Meeting:* 

- A motion will be made to call for the Standing Committees to authorize Church officer and committee positions for the 2018-2020 term.
- The Pastor will announce that the following members will serve on a Nominating Committee to select officers for the 2018-2020 term: David Bennett, Luke Fedders, Lee Michael (Chairman), Cindy Moore, Ellen Williams, and Joe Yates.
