The Pastor's Spotlight

Isn't it great to know that in every believer's life, God has begun a work of salvation and sanctification that He will continue until He comes back or until the believer leaves this life and goes to Him? "For I am confident of this very thing, that He who began a good work in you will perfect it until the day of Christ Jesus" (Philippians 1:6). Over the last month we have been studying the I AM statements that Jesus made about Himself. The Pew Perspective

Jesus' first sermon during His public ministry started with the Beatitudes, which means blessings. Found in Matthew 5:1-12, these sayings have often been looked at as Jesus' ethical teachings for good living, but they are so much more. In fact, the Beatitudes teach the Gospel message of sin and salvation that Jesus emphasized throughout His ministry. Another way to look at the Beatitudes is as Kingdom principles for Kingdom living for Kingdom citizens. As Jesus taught on a mountainside above the Sea of Galilee, He gathered His disciples closest to Him and taught them how believers could achieve spiritual happiness.

First, Jesus taught that being poor in spirit (v. 3) is the initial step to being blessed. When we compare ourselves to God's holiness, not other people's behavior, we realize that we are spiritually unable to work to better ourselves and that we have no reason for pride or self-righteousness. Understanding our true spiritual condition apart from God is the most basic requirement to be part of the kingdom of heaven.

The next step Jesus taught was to mourn over our $\sin(v. 4)$, or to have a deeply sorrowful attitude about our sin that results in repentance producing the comfort of God's forgiveness.

In turn, our salvation should lead to an attitude of meekness (v. 5). Being meek does not mean being weak, but gentle and humble, submissive, and useful before God. It is not those who are stubborn, willful, rebellious, and self-centered that ultimately get ahead, but those that trust and wait for the Lord's will and timing will receive all things.

The next stage of blessedness is a hunger and thirst for righteousness (v. 6), which is a passionate need to be in right standing with God that we can't accomplish ourselves but that God can completely fulfill. The happiness in life we seek is a by-product of the righteousness we find through salvation and not the goal itself.

Those who are filled with righteousness show the fruit of mercy (v, 7), showing forgiveness, sympathy, and compassion to the desperate and undeserving. God requires that we give mercy to others just as we receive it from Him.

The merciful in turn are characterized by a pure heart (v, 8), which is necessary to see God. In the Old Testament, no one could see God and live. But through the new covenant of grace, we can have a deep, personal relationship with the Lord through faith, prayer, and the Word until we see Him face to face in heaven.

The pure in heart are the peace makers (v. 9) who, having reached harmony with God ourselves, are called to create more peace as we lead others through evangelism to make peace with God on their own. We can further keep peace within the church as we are empowered by the Spirit of peace. We will be known as sons of God as we continue to more closely resemble the Prince of Peace.

And yet, vv. 10-12 tell us that we will be persecuted by a world hostile to the Gospel message and offended even by the silent rebuke of our righteous living. However, Jesus tells us to rejoice because God is testing us. As we share in Christ's sufferings, we can know that God will be glorified.
