The Pew Perspective

What are Christian ethics? Ethics are the rules of right and wrong behavior and the principles we use to determine what duties and actions we should perform. We rely on the Bible to orient us toward what is good and away from what is evil. But when we face the many issues and choices where there isn't one right answer in the Bible, we apply our core beliefs to do what we believe is best and honors God as we understand what He expects of us. Instead of long lists of rules and regulations to cover every possible circumstance and variable, Paul explained in the book of Romans how to follow our conscience. It is interesting that Paul spent the first three-quarters of *Romans* explaining the gospel, sin, salvation, and God's plans for His chosen people and Gentiles before addressing ethical issues. Only after laying a solid foundation of core Christian doctrine and theology does Paul discuss how we treat others: Out of the deep gratitude and love that we should feel toward for our Savior who died to save us from sin and give us everlasting life, we should willingly desire to love others through service and sacrifice so that all will come to worship and glorify the Father.

In Paul's day, some new Christians were concerned about eating meat as former Jews still felt bound by ceremonial rules about clean foods and Gentile believers who had recently turned away from sacrificing to pagan gods wanted to avoid their former practices. Christians who were stronger in their walk had no concerns where their meat came from because they knew that there was only one true and living God and that old rules and ways had no control over their lives. Paul explained that Christians had perfect liberty in Christ to follow their own conscience on such matters. However, out of love for their brothers and sisters in Christ who did believe eating meat sacrificed to idols was wrong, mature Christians should not do anything to cause those weaker believers to stumble by making it harder for them to have a clean conscience before the Lord. "...let us not judge one another anymore, but rather resolve this, not to put a stumbling block or a cause to fall in our brother's way" (Romans 14:13). In the same way, Christians who only ate vegetables to avoid idol-sacrificed meat should not condemn meat-eating Christians, and believers who ate meat should not look down on brothers who did not eat meat. "...For the kingdom of God is not eating and drinking, but righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit" (Romans 14:17).

In our day, we as Barnesville Baptists have our own customs, preferences, and practices that we enjoy and believe are good and valuable. However, as we seek to witness Christ's love to everyone and invite new people into our congregation, we must always be mindful not to do anything that would make it difficult for people to worship the Lord. For those who have worshiped together for a long time, it can be difficult to imagine the perspective of a newcomer who is not familiar with the building layout, when to stand and sit during the service, or how to interact with people you don't know. We should respect those whose preferences differ from ours so that whether they participate in or abstain from the liberties we enjoy in Christ, they know that they are loved and welcomed as brothers and sisters in Christ. We should follow our own conscience and allow others to follow theirs so that we can maintain unity, share the Gospel, and bring honor to the Lord together.

Business Meeting Briefs

Report from the 147th Annual Business Meeting in October:

- A resolution to begin the annual budget process for 2019 was adopted; the standing committees will report to the Treasurer by Nov. 4.
- The Church approved the membership applications of Cortland & Ola Moore, both by statement.
- The Select Committee on Nominations reported five motions to fill church officer and committee positions for 2018-2020, all of which were approved by the Church. These officers and committee members began their two-year positions on Oct. 4.

Expected at the November Business Meeting:

- The Outreach Cmte. will make a motion to pay for the meals of children 16 and under at the Dec. 9 Christmas dinner.
- The Internal Administration Cmte. will request increased spending authority for the Electric BLI by \$500, the Fuel Oil BLI by \$1,000, and the Official Vehicles BLI by \$5,000.


