The Pastor's Spotlight

As I sat down to write this article, the ground was muddy and brown since the last snow had melted. And then, as I looked out the window, it started to snow again. Wow, what a sense of peace and joy that filled my soul as everything that was ugly and dirty was turning a beautiful, pure white. I couldn't help myself but to just say "thank you, Lord, for saving my soul; thank you, Lord, for making me whole". As I watched out the window how the pure white and untouched snow was blanketing the ground all around me, I thought of how Jesus covers all of us when we receive Him as our Savior and Lord with His precious blood of forgiveness, and we become whiter than snow to our Father in heaven.

King David wrote *Psalm 51* after having Uriah killed and committing adultery with Bathsheba. In the midst of his anguish, David knew that by repenting of his sins he could receive forgiveness from the Lord: "Cleanse me with hyssop, and I will be clean; wash me, and I will be whiter than snow" (Psalm 51:7). The Apostle John also remarked on God's amazing power to redeem us: "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness" (I John 1:9). The hymn "Whiter than Snow" captures the essence of those scriptures: "Lord Jesus, I long to be perfectly whole; I want Thee forever to ransom my soul. Break down every idol, cast out every foe; Now wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow. Whiter than snow, yes whiter than snow; Now wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow".

As we move forward in 2019, my prayer as your pastor is to be more focused on God's Word and on having more opportunities for all of us to learn and to grow stronger in the Lord's Kingdom work together. Look for and anticipate the excitement of growing closer to God and to each other. Remember, we all need each other to be all that God wants us to be!



The Pew Perspective

The *Barnesville Lantern* has just passed the milestone of its 200th consecutive month of publication with the January 2019 issue. Two hundred months works out to 16 years and four months since the BBC newsletter was first delivered on Sunday, June 2, 2002. Having discussed the first 100 months in the September 2010 *Lantern*, let me offer a few reflections on our second 100 months.

Most of the *Lantern*'s features are well-set by now, but the right-hand side of page two continues to change over time. It took almost a decade to feature everyone who consented to be the "Member of the Month", but that consistent run ended in 2014, and shared that space with other interviews and the current pairing of scrambles and word searches until 2016. We have gained a handful of new members in the last several years, so I look forward to reviving the Member of the Month series before long and for as long as we have new members to feature.

Just as important as the words in the *Lantern* are the people who make the *Lantern* happen. Randy & Sandy Gilliam were key members of the *Lantern* team for five years' worth of issues in the second 100 months before their 2015 retirement. Following in their footsteps are Danny Moore, who is now the publisher and writer of the Pastor's Spotlight, as well as Jane Fowler, Linda Roberts, and Tina Appleton, who have played a vital role in folding, delivering, and mailing the *Lantern* each month. I thank each of them for their efforts.

It has been interesting to see how technology changes have affected the *Lantern*. We started out with 100% paper delivery, printing about 200 copies a month, but this month's print run is only 99 as more and more people opt for electronic delivery. This month's *Lantern* will be sent to 89 email addresses and advertised on our Facebook page, which will direct those tech-savvy readers to our new smart phone-friendly website. Newer printers and better camera resolution have improved our picture and graphics quality considerably.

So why do we keep printing the *Lantern*? Successful television series have wrapped up with far fewer than 200 episodes, but that's not good enough for a church working on 150 years of ministry. Pastor Danny and I continue to hear that the *Lantern* helps people feel connected to BBC whether they're regular attenders, away for the summer, or unable to physically attend at all. The *Lantern* is also our book of *Acts*, recording how God has been faithful to this congregation over the years, growing us over time into the people He wants us to be for His Kingdom. As long as the *Lantern* can connect us in the present, prepare us for the future, and remind us of where we've come from, we'll continue to communicate with you each month. The Lord willing, I'll be back to you in May 2027 with a report on our 300th *Lantern*.

Report from the Monthly Business Meeting in January:

- The Pastor announced the retirement of Paul Foster as Choir Director as of April 21, 2019 and called for volunteers to serve on a Select Committee on Nominations to select a successor.
- The Pastor made a motion to consider installing a living space in the parsonage attic, which was referred to the Internal Administration Cmte.

- The Internal Administration Cmte., further to the recommendation of the Pastor and Deacons, will move to approve the commemoration of the late Dorothy (Roberson) Piper for her bequest to BBC with an engraved nameplate on a multi-name plaque.
- The Pastor and Deacons will recommend dismissing two inactive members from church membership upon their request.
- The Pastor will announce that the following members will serve on a Nominating Committee to select a candidate for Choir Director: Ann Bennett, Jan Burdette, Lisa Fedders, Roy Leibrand, Lee Michael, Cindy Moore, and Ed Williams.
