The Pew Perspective

Are you familiar with the story of Mephibosheth? He was a minor Old Testament character, but his story is important because it shows why King David was a man after God's own heart and how David's kindness toward an unimportant and undeserving man is exactly how God's grace works.

David went looking for Mephibosheth to show grace. "Now David said, 'Is there still anyone who is left of the house of Saul, that I may show him kindness for Jonathan's sake" (II Samuel 9:1)? It would have been perfectly acceptable for David to kill Mephibosheth as a descendant of his enemy King Saul and rival for the throne. However, David sought Mephibosheth out as the son of his beloved friend Jonathan. God is fully justified in punishing us for sin, but instead offers us forgiveness and mercy because He loves us. "But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8).

Mephibosheth had done nothing to deserve David's favor. Indeed, with both of his feet lame (II Samuel 4:4), Mephibosheth was physically incapable of doing anything to impress David. Our salvation is just as undeserved and unearned. "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast" (Ephesians 2:8-9).

Mephibosheth lived in obscurity and exile when David found him. He was living in someone's else house in the barren land of Lo-Debar (II Samuel 9:5), which means "no pasture" in Hebrew. As sinners, we are cut off from the blessings and abundant life that God has for His children. "... You were without Christ, being aliens from the commonwealth of Israel and strangers from the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world" (Ephesians 2:12).

David's favor restored Mephibosheth's inheritance, granting him all the lands owned by King Saul, as well as Saul's servants to work the land (II Samuel 9:9-10). As king, Saul would have owned the best fields in Israel. David tasked Saul's old servant, Ziba, along with Ziba's 15 sons and 20 servants, to work the land and bring in the harvest. If the families of those 36 numbered people were included, Mephibosheth had a workforce that easily could have been in the triple digits. In an instant, Mephibosheth went from one of the poorest to one of the richest men in Israel. As believers, we too are given a rich inheritance. "...God, ...according to His abundant mercy has begotten us...to an inheritance incorruptible and undefiled and that does not fade away, reserved in heaven for you..." (I Peter 1:3-4).

Mephibosheth enjoyed David's favor for the rest of his life. David didn't merely restore Mephibosheth's property and then send him away. David made Mephibosheth a member of the royal household to be in fellowship with the king and his family and friends. "...'he shall eat at my table like one of the king's sons" (II Samuel 9:11). Just as David wanted to have Mephibosheth near him, the Lord desires close fellowship and relationship with us. "The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs—heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ...". (Romans 8:15-17). The Lord's amazing grace rescues us from sin and spiritual exile, sets us on a path of growth and blessing, and allows us to enjoy His company forevermore.

- A motion to hold a retirement luncheon for Paul Foster on Apr. 28 was referred to the Outreach Committee.

- The Select Committee on Auditing will present its report on the 2018 finances.
