"...When Jesus knew that His hour had come that He should depart from this world to the Father, having loved His own who were in the world, He loved them to the end" (John 13:1).

Jesus spoke of "His hour" at several key times during His earthly ministry, showing that He clearly understood His Father's will for Him as the Messiah from the beginning. There were many occasions when His enemies had opportunities to attack or arrest Jesus when He criticized their hard hearts and unbelief or when He claimed to be equal with God, but He always slipped through their fingers. It wasn't until God's timing was ready and Jesus' ministry of teaching, preaching, and healing was complete that the Pharisees and Sadducees could touch Him.

The first time Jesus spoke of "His hour" was at the wedding in Cana where He performed His first miracle of changing water into wine at Mary's request. "Jesus said to her, "Woman, what does your concern have to do with Me? My hour has not yet come" (John 2:4). Jesus' reluctance to do what His mother asked makes sense when understood in the context of His divine timetable. As the promised Messiah, Jesus knew that His suffering and death on the cross would come before the blessings of the millennial age when wine would be enjoyed by Israel in abundance. "I will bring back the captives of My people Israel...They shall plant vineyards and drink wine from them..." (Amos 9:14).

Jesus' enemies started ploting against Him early in His ministry, but He was able to frustrate them every time. When Jesus left Galilee to teach at the Temple in Jerusalem during the Feast of Tabernacles, His enemies objected to His teaching, but none rose up to seize Him. "Therefore they sought to take Him; but no one laid a hand on Him, because His hour had not yet come" (John 7:30). Shortly thereafter, the Pharisees confronted Jesus for His teachings several times. "These words Jesus spoke in the treasury, as He taught in the temple; and no one laid hands on Him, for His hour had not yet come" (John 8:20). Even when Jesus told the Pharisees that before Abraham was, He was the "I AM", He was untouched. While the Pharisees sought to stone Him for blasphemy, Jesus evaded them and left Jerusalem.

Just as Jesus knew when it was too early for His death, He also knew when the time for His ultimate sacrifice had come. Jesus explained to His disciples about His coming death after His triumphal, and final, entry into Jerusalem. "But Jesus answered them, saying, "The hour has come that the Son of Man should be glorified" (John 12:23). Again, after the Last Supper, "Jesus spoke these words, lifted up His eyes to heaven, and said: 'Father, the hour has come. Glorify Your Son, that Your Son also may glorify You…'" (John 17:1). Jesus was prepared to obey Father's will and undergo all the pain and punishment of His trials, scourging, and crucifixion. Just as Judas came into the Garden of Gethsemane to arrest Jesus, He again referenced "His Hour", saying, "The hour has come; behold, the Son of Man is being betrayed into the hands of sinners" (Mark 14:41).

We know what happened next, and how the death and sadness of Good Friday turned into resurrection and eternal life on Easter Sunday. It is now our turn to wait for that unknown day and hour when He will come back for us (Matthew 25:13)! Until then, it is our calling to share the good news of Easter with all mankind.
