The Pastor's Spotlight

We have been looking at God's Word the last two weeks concerning the precious blood of Jesus. My prayer is that we would be better prepared to celebrate and to remember Jesus' sacrifice of His body and blood when we gather together on the first Sunday of every month to partake of the Lord's Supper together. "For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until He comes" (I Corinthians 11:26). At the Lord's Supper, real joy and peace can be celebrated and we all should be united with Jesus in His love. The Lord's desire certainly was that all of His followers should be united in Him. He prayed for those who were with Him and also for all who would follow that they would be one: "My prayer is not for them alone. May they also be in Us so that the world may believe that You have sent Me" (John 17:20-21).

The ordinance that we partake in with the bread and juice is a picture of "...the incomparable riches of [God's] grace, expressed in His kindness to us in Christ Jesus" (Ephesians *2:7*). The foundational beliefs of all Christian faith are the death, burial, and bodily resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ. It is around this fundamental truth that all Christians should be united. If the Church could look beyond its many differences and denominations, imagine what a powerful witness it would make to a world desperately seeking the joy, peace, and rest only God can give. This has always been my prayer for BBC, that we would be united with all believers in Jesus and to share the resources that God has given us to reach the lost, hell-bound people all around us, so that they will see God's love in us as we reach out in the name of Jesus together and to love them into the Kingdom of God. The Pew Perspective

Many times, faith is defined by the world as trusting in something without any evidence, or contrary to reason. That is never the meaning of faith in the Scripture. Instead, biblical faith is believing in and acting on what God has said or promised will happen because He has always proven to be truthful and reliable. Even if we cannot currently see or understand why we should rely on God's Word, we know that because of His trustworthiness, what He says will be in the future is even more reliable than what exists in the present. In Romans 4, the Apostle Paul taught that Abraham's justification, his right-standing before God, was accomplished by faith alone and not works. Our salvation is likewise based on our faith in Jesus as Lord and Savior. The FAITH acronym helps explain Paul's point that faith isn't just about mere agreement, but application and action as well.

F is for facts--the objective, historical truth about God's promises. Whether God is blessing one person's life or offering salvation to anyone who believes in His Son, what God says will happen or will be shall fully come to pass. God promised Abram, a childless man living in Ur, that he would be the ancestor of a great nation that blessed the world. "I will make you a great nation; I will bless you...And in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed" (Genesis 12:2-3). It took many years for Abram to see God's promises become his reality, and indeed God is still delivering on that promise from one generation to the next. "He remembers His covenant forever: the word which He commanded. for a thousand generations" (Psalm 105:8).

A is for agreement--belief that the facts are real. When God told an even older, childless Abram that his descendants would be innumerable, "...he believed in the Lord, and He accounted it to him for righteousness" (Genesis 15:6). Even though those facts did not yet exist, Abram trusted God that they would be so. "Abraham...believed God, who gives life to the dead and calls those things which do not exist as though they did..." (Romans 4:16-17). Today, we can easily see the physical proof and reality that Abraham had a multitude of descendants. Abraham's faith in that promised future was no less strong than our acceptance of present reality.

I is for internalization—considering that the facts matter and apply to me and my life. For Abraham, God's promises meant he was content to live in tents in a distant land instead of his birthplace. "By faith he dwelt in the land of promise as in a foreign country..." (Hebrews 11:9). Abraham's life was radically different than it used to be because His faith in God changed who he was, where he lived, and why what he was doing with his life mattered. As Christian believers, the fact that Jesus of Nazareth died on a cross 2,000 years ago matters here and now. Our spiritual condition today, how we live our earthly lives, and how we spend eternity are all dependent on the fact that the Son of God was resurrected and has borne our sins for us so that we can be saved.

T is for trust--action and commitment, repentance. Agreeing with and internalizing God's truth changes our lives from the way we think to what we care about to how we spend

our time and energy. "Now the Lord had said to Abram: 'Get out of your country, from your family and from your father's house, to a land that I will show you'" (Genesis 12:1). When God told Abram that he would inherit lands and have many children, Abram didn't just nod in agreement as if God merely said something inspirational and then go back to what he was doing. Abram packed up his household and family and left everything he knew for an uncertain destination. He just went. "So Abram departed as the Lord had spoken to him…" (Genesis 12:4); "...And he went out, not knowing where he was going" (Hebrews 11:8). When we accept God's offer of salvation, repent of our sins, and trust in Jesus to sanctify us in His righteousness, our lives are so altered that we call it being "born again", passing from our old selves to new life in Christ.

H is for hope--believing in what you have not yet seen. By the time Isaac was born to Abraham and Sarah, there was no earthly, logical, rational explanation for how two people of their extremely advanced age could bear children. But that didn't matter because "[Abraham]...contrary to hope, in hope believed, so that he became the father of many nations, according to what was spoken..." (Romans 4:18). Abraham's trust in a trustworthy God meant that the impossible was possible if the Lord had promised it. "He did not waver at the promise of God through unbelief, but was strengthened in faith, giving glory to God, and being fully convinced that what He had promised He was also able to perform" (Romans 4:20-21).

So faith in God's promises is nothing like throwing pennies in wishing wells or believing things will get better by ignoring the hard truth. We can depend on the Creator of all things to change anything if He has promised it. When we accept God's offer of salvation through faith, it is as real, secure, and permanent as when a mountain climber latches onto a granite rock face. Faith doesn't just move mountains, it is a mountain.
