

The Pew Perspective

One of Jesus' prominent ministries was healing the sick. His miraculous healings led many people to praise God but was also a source of criticism from hostile and unbelieving religious leaders. The common belief in that day was that sickness was a result of sin. While in some cases that was true, Jesus also taught that various illnesses and sufferings happened so that God's glory would be revealed through healing. Several times, Jesus noted someone's expression of faith as the basis for his or her healing. We can draw several spiritual principles from Jesus' healings in the Gospels.

Blindness: Sin prevents men from finding their way, spiritually. In *John 9:1-7*, a man blind from birth whom Jesus sent to wash in the pool of Siloam received his sight by listening to Jesus and following His instructions. Even though Jesus' methods may have been unusual, the results were amazing. We can learn from this example that believing in Jesus, the Light of the World, gives spiritual sight and direction.

Leprosy: Sin, like leprosy in Jesus' day, was an incurable condition that had no worldly solution. Those stricken with leprosy were excluded from society and forced to live apart for fear of transmitting their disease. However, Jesus was not afraid to interact with or even touch lepers. In *Matthew 8*, a leper who came worshipping Jesus asked for healing. "Jesus put out His hand and touched him, saying, 'I am willing; be cleansed'. Immediately his leprosy was cleansed" (Matthew 8:3). From this story, we can see that putting your trust in Jesus for salvation is the only way to cure sin's curse.

Paralysis: Unable to move their own bodies, paralytics in the Gospels were carried by others to reach Jesus. As sinners, we are similarly powerless and incapable of functioning in a spiritual sense. In *Matthew 9*, Jesus responded to the faith of a paralytic's friends and forgave the man's sins. Jesus, in response to a scoffing scribe, "...said to the paralytic, 'Arise, take up your bed, and go to your house'. And he arose and departed to his house" (Matthew 9:6-7). From this lesson we learn that only faith in Jesus can restore people to spiritual health and ability.

Death: Jesus had compassion on a weeping widow in the city of Nain who had lost her only son. Sin makes men spiritually dead; we are completely separated from God, the source of life, in our trespasses and unbelief. However, Jesus, the Son of God, brought the widow's son back to life. "Then He came and touched the open coffin, and those who carried him stood still. And He said, 'Young man, I say to you, arise'. So he who was dead sat up and began to speak..." (Luke 7:14-15). What this account tells us is that Jesus, and only Jesus, has the power to resurrect the physically and spiritually dead to eternal life.

Just as Jesus healed the physically sick and infirm, He can also save us from our spiritual bondage and darkness. When we reach out to Him in faith and repentance, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Business Meeting Briefs


Report from the Monthly Business Meeting in September:
