The Pew Perspective

One of the reasons that the old-time Christmas carols have been enjoyed for generations is that they pack a lot of Scripture into the lyrics. One of the most biblically-based songs is Charles Wesley's "Hark! the Herald Angels Sing", which he first wrote in 1739. The three stanzas that we are familiar with today declare Jesus' divinity and humanity, affirm the doctrines of the virgin birth and the incarnation, teach Christ's Lordship, prove the inerrancy of the Scriptures through the fulfillment of prophecy, and preach the salvation message and the good news of Gospel. Below are the lyrics (minus the refrain) of "Hark! the

Herald Angels Sing", followed by the verse(s) from the Old and New Testaments that are the foundation for the words. It is obvious that the first stanza comes straight out of *Luke 2*. If you don't remember what the angels said to the shepherds abiding in the field at night, sing the first stanza and you'll have *Luke 2:10-14* covered. *John I*'s focus on the Word made flesh is prominent in the second stanza, while the third has verses that focus on Christ's first and second coming and the reason why He came as the Son of Man.

Business Meeting Briefs

Report from the Monthly Business Meeting in November:

- The Nominating Cmte.'s motions to fill standing committee and church officer positions for the remainder of the 2018-2020 term were adopted.
- The Church approved the membership applications of John & Doris Kiser, each coming by statement.

Expected at the December Business Meeting:

- The Finance Cmte. will offer a motion to approve its recommended 2020 Church budget of \$214,602, which is \$4,843 less than the 2019 adjusted budget amount of \$219,445.
- The Internal Administration Cmte. will request increased spending authority for the 2019 Electric BLI by \$1,000 and the 2019 Fuel Oil BLI by \$1,500.

Barnesville Baptist Church (BBC) in Maryland has developed a ministry with a local health rehabilitation center. Many of the church members have spent time at the center during an extended illness.

The church leads music with a short devotional twice a month, but the most significant impact is the one-to-one ministry, says BBC Pastor Danny Moore.

"We've built a great relationship with the center," Moore says. "We get to go and pray with people in the rooms. They'll also call us if someone is not doing well." Recently one patient asked for prayer for her son, who was dying of cancer. Moore said it was wonderful for this woman to have a chance to share her concerns.

Sermons now on Facebook Live. BBC has started streaming live video of Sunday morning sermons on its Facebook page (facebook.com/barnesvillebaptist church), which has been received very enthusiastically by



those who are sick or unable to attend services in person. As of press time, the Nov. 17 sermon was viewed by 263 people. The sermons begin approximately 11:15 am. The idea to use Facebook's live

streaming service was discussed at a "Social Media and the Church" breakout session at the November BCM/D annual meeting.
