The Pew Perspective

Did you know that all but one of the Ten Commandments (found in Exodus 20:1-17) are restated in the New Testament? Whereas the Old Testament provided a list of rules to keep the Jewish people from engaging in proscribed behavior, the New Testament emphasizes believers' relationship with and love for God to keep them in fellowship with Him. Even so, Old Testament practices translate into New Testament principles, as what was begun in the past is fulfilled by a saving relationship with Jesus Christ. As we compare each of the Ten Commandments with their counterpart in the words of Christ and the apostles, we can see how God's eternal truth is unchanging.

"No other gods before Me": In Acts 14:14-15, Paul and Barnabas told the people of Lystra that there was only one true God and Creator of the universe.

"No carved images": In I John 5:21, the Apostle John told believers to avoid idols.

"Do not take the Lord's name in vain": James, the brother of Jesus, instructed Christians to be honest in their dealings and avoid swearing rash oaths (James 5:12).

"Keep the Sabbath holy": Moses' rule for seventh-day (Saturday) rest is no longer binding, but the basic principle remains. In Colossians 2:16, Paul wrote that rules about food, holidays, and days of worship were past. While Sunday worship commemorates Jesus' resurrection for Christians, you can worship on any--or every--day of the week. What is more important is that we worship "in spirit and truth".

"Honor your parents": In Ephesians 6:1, Paul encouraged children to obey their parents to please the Lord.

"Shall not murder": In I John 3:15, the Apostle John, echoing Jesus' words in Matthew 5:22, said that those who hated were murderers, and murderers do not have eternal life.

"Shall not commit adultery": In *I Corinthians 6:9-10*, Paul warned that those who practice sexual immorality of all kinds would not inherit the kingdom of God.

"Shall not steal": In *Ephesians 4:28*, Paul preached against stealing, encouraging people to work so that they may be able to give to others.

"Shall not lie": In Colossians 3:9-10, Paul preached against lying, saying that it did not belong in the life of one who had died to sin.

"Shall not covet": In Ephesians 5:3, Paul said that covetousness was unfitting for saints.

The New Testament's teachings on ethics emphasize love for God rather than concern for avoiding punishment as the motive for obeying Him. The power and guidance of the Holy Spirit in a born-again believer's life enables righteous living instead of relying on fear of becoming ceremonially unclean to avoid sinning. For Christians, following the Ten Commandments is no longer the minimum necessary to stay on God's good side, but is the foundation for deepening our relationship with Him and showing ever more care and kindness to others.
