The Pastor's Spotlight

The core of Jesus' message here on earth was the good news of His Kingdom. He came to deliver salvation and hope to those who were in despair and darkness. "...Jesus went into Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God. 'The time has come,' He said. 'The kingdom of God has come near. Repent and believe the good news' (Mark 1:14-15)! That is still the message that we as believers are to proclaim today. Now, more than ever, people are receptive to hearing good news. Many are dealing with personal storms like they have never faced before, such as uncertain health, lost jobs, stressed-out family members, and financial concerns.

Jesus showed His power over any storm when the boat He and His disciples were on was caught in a tempest: "A furious squall came up, and the waves broke over the boat, so that it was nearly swamped. Jesus was in the stern, sleeping on a cushion. The disciples woke Him and said to Him, "Teacher, don't you care if we drown?" He got up, rebuked the wind and said to the waves, "Quiet! Be still!" Then the wind died down and it was completely calm. He said to His disciples, "Why are you so afraid? Do you still have no faith" (Mark 4:37-39)? This passage demonstrates the divine power that Jesus has over everything. The disciples weren't saved by a ship captain or a weatherman. Instead, the One who created the seas, land, and skies spoke a word and all was at peace. We can see that it is possible to replace the fears of this life with a life of peace that only can be found in Jesus if we believe in Him. Just as Jesus expected faith from His followers, we too can experience the amazing peace of Jesus when we trust in Him to save us. As Christians, it is our awesome task and privilege to share the great news about Jesus with everyone. We are to stay focused on the task at hand, not the hindrances that Satan places in our way. The great news of the gospel will always go forward!

I know that we are in the midst of a storm right now, but pray that the God of peace will, first, calm your heart, and second, calm the waves around you, in His good time. Stay focused on God and all the good that He is doing, and we will all be back together to worship physically again very soon.

The Pew Perspective

When we do finally resume in-person worship, we will have to adapt to a lot of changes in where we sit, how we greet each other, and what our service looks like in our coronavirus world. (However, why we gather and Whom we worship will never change). The adjustments will be annoying, sound silly, but will be completely necessary to show Christian love and care for others' safety and health.

In the latter chapters of Romans, the Apostle Paul took a lot of time to talk about Christian ethics. the attitudes and behaviors that were expected from followers of Christ. In Paul's day, one of the biggest controversies within the church was about the eating of meat that had been sacrificed to idols before it was sold in the market. For some Christians, it was just food and it didn't matter where it came from. To other believers, such meat was a painful reminder of a dark religious past. Paul fully agreed with those who didn't see the meat as a big deal. However, Paul would have no part in causing weaker believers to have doubts, worries, or fears about their relationship with God because of meat. "Yet if your brother is grieved because of your food, you are no longer walking in love. Do not destroy with your food the one for whom Christ died. Therefore do not let your good be spoken of as evil..." (Romans 14:14-15). Even though we have liberty as Christians, it is a liberty to do good and to love others. If we overextend our liberty to the point that we are hurting others, then we are mistreating those whom Christ valued so much that He died on the cross to save.

That is the same attitude we need to have as we make decisions as a congregation about how we come back together physically. Our age range extends from newborns to over 90. We have both healthy young people and cancer survivors sitting in our pews. The best solutions for BBC will take into account the "least of these". For as many who are eager to get back into the house of the Lord to worship, there are those who are cautious and concerned about the risks of catching an invisible, highly communicable disease. As a charter member of the "but we've always done it that way" club, I will be there to grumble under my breath right there along with you, but I will put aside my own personal comforts and preferences if it means another fellow believer is put at ease*. If I can make it three months without a haircut, I know I can get through what we need to do at BBC to stay safe. "We then who are strong ought to bear with the scruples of the weak, and not to please ourselves. Let each of us please his neighbor for his good, leading to edification" (Romans 15:1-2). As we pray that we will soon be able to gather again, let's also ask the Lord to give each one of us an extra dose of sensitivity and concern for the needs of those around us.
