The Pew Perspective

Are you prepared for Christmas? For many of us, getting ready for Christmas means a month or more of chores and activities like wrapping presents, writing cards, stringing lights, decorating a Christmas tree, cleaning the house, and grocery shopping. To prepare for the first Christmas, God took much longer to arrange for the advent of His Son, about 15 months of advance work to set the stage for Christ's birth.

The first step was to get a priest named Zacharias ready to be a father. "Well advanced" in years, along with his wife, Elizabeth, Zacharias had long before put away any thoughts of being a father. But just like Abraham & Sarah, Zacharias & Elizabeth were about to become parents when they least expected it. The angel Gabriel told Zacharias that his son would get Israel ready for God. By Zacharias' day, God had been silent for four centuries, and the Jews were spiritually adrift, so John would bring them back to the Lord. "He will also go before Him in the spirit and power of Elijah, 'to turn the hearts of the fathers to the children,' and the disobedient to the wisdom of the just, to make ready a people prepared for the Lord" (Luke 1:17). But when Gabriel explained God's plans, Zacharias' doubt resulted in muteness until the naming ceremony for his newborn son, John. Nine months of silence gave Zacharias plenty of time to focus on what was ahead, for his first words after his extended quiet time included this prophecy: "And you, child, will be called the prophet of the Highest; for you will go before the face of the Lord to prepare His ways, to give knowledge of salvation to His people by the remission of their sins..." (Luke 1:76-77).

Elizabeth also needed time to prepare for motherhood. *Luke 1:24* says she *"hid herself five months"*, most likely as an act of worship to focus on the Lord's life-changing grace in her life. Just like Hannah in the Old Testament, Elizabeth's pregnancy lifted a social stigma of not having children. Elizabeth and Mary prepared together for the miraculous sons they received from the Lord, both surprised but both grateful to be chosen to serve the Lord in unique and special ways.

Just as God prepared John's parents, God, through John, prepared Israel for Jesus. In *Matthew 3*, John preached repentance and baptism before Jesus' ministry. Many across Israel responded to John's message to reject sin and seek after God. It was John who called out Jesus as the Lamb of God, who baptized Him to inaugurate His ministry, and whose followers, among them Andrew and Simon Peter, began to follow Jesus. As Jesus began to increase in public stature and attention, John celebrated that fact, saying, "He must increase, but I must decrease" (John 3:30).

It is remarkable that God also prepared the whole world to receive Jesus at just the right time and place. Jesus was born in the Roman Empire, whose network of roads and shipping lanes would allow missionaries like Paul and the other apostles to travel across Europe and Asia. Many different nations and cultures shared the language of law and government, Latin, and the language of culture and education, Greek, so that all could receive and understand the Gospel message. As we prepare for an unusual Christmas this year, let's make sure that we first prepare ourselves to focus on and appreciate Jesus.
