The Pew Perspective

During the first Lord's Supper, the 12 apostles began to argue about which of them was the greatest. Jesus upended the argument by pointing out that He, who was greater than all of them, was serving them. Unlike the Gentiles, they were not to strive for rank, power, and position so they could look down on and mistreat others. "For who is greater, he who sits at the table, or he who serves? Is it not he who sits at the table? Yet I am among you as the One who serves" (Luke 22:27). This was not the first time during His earthly life and ministry that Jesus denied Himself the benefits and privileges due Him while providing them to others. It was not His Father's purpose at His first coming to receive glory, honor, and blessings. Consider the following:

Jesus was hungry in the wilderness while being tempted by the devil and refused to turn stones into bread (Matthew 4:2). Yet He was able to easily feed the multitudes with just a handful of fish and loaves (John 6:51).

Jesus was thirsty on the cross, and voluntarily endured all the savagery and pain of crucifixion to take the punishment for our sins (John 19:28). Yet He is the water of life for us, so that we are supplied with an eternal fountain of spiritual blessings and will never thirst again (John 4:14).

Jesus grew weary living as a human being, enduring the griefs and misfortunes of this life, laboring as the son of a carpenter, and walking the hard and dusty roads of Israel as an itinerant preacher (John 4:6). Yet He is our rest, so that when we trust in Him, our souls find comfort and peace in the arms of a gentle and humble Savior (Matthew 11:29-30).

Jesus paid tribute and gave lawful obedience to the governing powers and authorities of His day, from the oppressive Roman conquerors who imposed heavy and unfair taxes to the corrupt and unworthy religious authorities who abused the sacrificial system for their own benefit and power (Matthew 17:27). Yet He is the King of kings who will one day rule the nations with a rod of iron, will judge all mankind, and will set all things right (Revelation 19:16).

Jesus prayed to His Father and cried out with His needs and petitions as a faithful worshiper of the Lord Almighty, and submitted to the Lord's will in His Life (Mark 14:32-42). Yet He is our faithful High Priest, and sits at the right hand of His Father in heaven as we petition Him (John 14:13-14).

Jesus wept, experiencing pain, loss, disappointment and all the human emotions and feelings we go through in this life (John 11:35). Yet He dries our tears, and in Heaven, there will be no more death, sorrow, or crying as He comforts us forever more (Revelation 21:4).

Jesus was sold out and betrayed by Judas Iscariot to the Jewish religious leaders for 30 pieces of silver, the price of a slave (Matthew 26:15). Yet He who was treated as a slave and criminal worthy of death redeemed the world, freeing us from sin, adopting us into His family, and guaranteeing us an eternal inheritance (I Peter 1:18-19).

Jesus was put to death, horribly scourged, crucified, and buried for three days (John 19:33). Yet He raises the dead, from Jairus' son to Lazarus to everyone who is born again through faith in His saving grace (John 5:25).

As we consider how to be followers of Jesus, remember His words in Luke 10:37: "...go and do likewise".
