### The Pew Perspective

Almost 1,500 years before Jesus died on the cross, the children of Israel were being bitten by fiery serpents in the wilderness, many of them suffering and even dying for their sin and rebellion against God. But even in that time of judgment, God provided a way for salvation. He instructed Moses to make a bronze serpent and mount it on a pole. All the Israelites had to do to survive the snakes' venom was look at the bronze serpent in the midst of their camp and they would live (Numbers 21:8-9).

So many centuries later, Jesus recounted that Old Testatement story to Nicodemus, telling him that "...as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so *must the Son of Man be lifted up" (John 3:14).* Just like their sinful ancestors, who received grace and mercy by trusting God's offer of forgiveness, the Jewish people gathered in Jerusalem for the Passover would look upon Jesus elevated upon another pole, the cross. The children of Israel's physical healing from snakebite was accomplished by nothing more than faith in Moses' instructions. In the first century and today, we receive spiritual salvation by trusting in Jesus' work on the cross. Jesus explained to Nicodemus that no one could ascend to God except Him because He first descended from heaven. We are familiar with what we gained when Jesus came down to be lifted up, but let us also consider what Jesus freely surrendered to rescue us. Jesus gave up His glory (John 17:5). He dwelled with His Father in unapproachable light (I Timothy 6:16) but set aside His heavenly honor, power, riches, and angelic worship to live among us. Jesus made himself of no reputation (Philippians 2:7). He who sat at the right hand of the Power was content to be raised as a poor man in an unimportant village of a forgotten corner of a small country before He lived as an itinerant preacher, with no home of His own. Jesus submitted to worldly authority (Matthew 17:27). The King of Kings and Lord of Lords showed honor to ungodly rulers and respect for human customs. Jesus abstained from using His divine power (John 5:19). He voluntarily confined Himself to the limits of the human condition so that He could live among us as one of us. He experienced pain, deprivation, injustice, and temptation firsthand when He could have been rescued by a legion of angels at any time. Jesus was obedient unto death (Hebrews 5:8). He accepted His Father's will that He would sacrifice His sinless life for the lives of sinners. Jesus died on a cross (Galatians 3:13). He took on the curse of the law so we could receive the blessings of faith in His name.

As we remember Jesus' great humility and suffering during His life and ministry in the weeks leading up to Easter, it is even more important to recall that Jesus overcame and conquered all that sin, death, and Satan could muster. Jesus endured the cross, despised the shame, and laid hold of the joy set before Him (*Hebrews 12:2*). He is sitting again with His Father, waiting for us to join Him.

*Easter services*. The 2021 celebration of Jesus' resurrection will start on Palm Sunday, Mar. 28. A Good Friday service will be held at 7:00 pm on Apr. 2. On Apr. 4, Easter Sunday, special music will be presented. Plans for a BBC-only sunrise service are being discussed; stay tuned for specifics.

Annie Armstrong Easter Offering. The 2021 Week of Prayer for North American Missions and the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering is Mar. 7-14. This year's theme is "The Mission Moves Forward" based on I Corinthians 15:58: "Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, be steadfast, immovable, always excelling in the Lord's work, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain".

The SBC's national goal is \$70 million; BBC's is \$2,000. Every dollar given goes to train and resource thousands of missionaries involved in church planting and compassion ministries who share the life-transforming gospel of Jesus Christ across the United States and Canada.

The offering was started in 1895 by the Woman's Missionary Union (WMU) to benefit the work of the Home Mission Board (now the North American Mission Board). In 1934, it was named in honor of Annie Armstrong, a bold missions advocate and the WMU's first national executive leader. Generations of Southern Baptists have given over \$1 billion to the cause since then. Please prayerfully consider how you can support this vital missions effort.
