The Pew Perspective

Way back in the (late) 1900s when I was a Boy Scout, we would have "Advancement Nights". By tying knots, demonstrating first aid skills, and showing off camping, hiking, and orienteering abilities, you could check off the boxes and earn ranks and merit badges. That system of advancement and achievement was great for teaching skills and acquiring knowledge, but it has little to do with what we at Barnesville Baptist Church will doing with our focus on discipleship.

Discipleship is about becoming more like Jesus, not "fixing" people so they are more diligent to earn Christian "points" or become more active church members. Active participation and church membership are good things, but they are not the goal of discipleship. Some of the best people in the Bible at scripture reading, worship attendance, tithing, fasting, and prayer were the Pharisees, a group for whom Jesus had little praise. As you read through the Bible, you will see that the Jewish people had hundreds of rules-merit badges if you'd like-about appropriate religious behavior, activities, etiquette, and traditions, none of which really made them better people on the inside when it came to knowing and loving God in a real and meaningful relationship, which is what God really wants from us. "Therefore be imitators of God as dear children" (Ephesians 5:1).

As we give greater attention and emphasis to discipleship at BBC, know that this will not be just another "program" or educational training initiative. As part of the Great Commission mandate from Jesus to "...teach them to obey all things ... " (Matthew 28:20), we will share knowledge about the Bible, prayer, and spiritual gifts, but more importantly how to apply and use that knowledge so we are changed from the inside out. Again, discipleship is not something we can do by gritting our teeth and trying harder to do more Christian "stuff". We will rely on the power and presence of the Holy Spirit to grow, develop, and mature each one of us on an individual basis and schedule. Discipleship won't be something we work on for a year and then move on to something else. It needs to become a part of everything we do as a church body because discipleship is a lifelong journey. "For to this you were called, because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that you should follow His steps..." (I Peter 2:21).

Hopefully having spent some time on what discipleship is not, an explanation of what discipleship is will now be more useful. Our goal for intentional discipleship is to follow Christ more genuinely and fully in our lives. As we come to personally know and experience more about Jesus, we will be transformed (Romans 12:2) as we grow to love Him in a deeper and fuller way. Over time, as we learn His truths and obey His commands, we will enjoy communicating with Him, doing what He wants, thinking and acting more like Him, prioritizing what He values, spending more time with Him, and then teaching and telling others about Him so His Kingdom is multiplied. "Then Jesus said to His disciples, "If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow Me" (Matthew 16:24).

As we mature in our discipleship, watch how God uses us in greater and mightier ways in our ministry, worship, fellowship, and evangelism efforts. As we abide in Him, we will bear fruit for His glory (John 15:4-5) and be all that He wants us to be.



- Pastor Danny Moore, Lee Michael, and Luke Fedders were approved to serve as messengers to the 86th Montgomery Baptist Association Annual Meeting, held on Oct. 16 at BBC.
- A resolution to begin the annual budget process for 2021 was adopted; the standing committees will report to the Treasurer by Nov. 7.

- A motion to donate up to 30 metal chairs to a sister church will be offered by the Internal Administration Cmte.
