

The Pew Perspective

Oh no, it's Christmas time again! While some people (on page 1) find it

easy to be full of Christmas cheer, others of us find ourselves at this time of year sympathizing with that iconic Christmas character, the Grinch, from Dr. Seuss' 1966



Stole Christmas!" Like Ebenezer Scrooge before him, the Grinch found the Christmas celebrations going on all around him just a bit too much and too loud at times. When I see Christmas decorations out and Christmas songs being played before Halloween or can't open a webpage after

Thanksgiving without being swamped with Black Friday ads, I too would like to bag up all the commercialism and busyness of Christmas and toss it out. Before you send me complaints about my lack of Christmas spirit, I already have a Christmas tree of my own up!

Just like today, people in the first century had different reactions to Jesus' birth: not everyone was equally excited and some were outright hostile. Mary and Joseph were allin and preparing for the first Christmas months in advance, per Matthew 1 and Luke 2. The Bethlehem shepherds, according to Luke 2:8-20, were enthusiastic witnesses of Jesus' birth, but only stayed for a short time. The wise men missed the festivities by several years but brought great gifts, according to *Matthew 2:11*. There were even first-century Scrooges and Grinches who didn't like Christmas. The priests and scribes in Jerusalem knew all about the expected birth of the Messiah and where it would take place (Matthew 2:5-6) but couldn't be bothered to visit Bethlehem.

And then there was King Herod, the greatest Christmas villain of them all. He was "troubled" in Matthew 2:3 to learn of the birth of the King of the Jews when he was certain that the position was already filled—by himself! What Herod did next isn't covered by most Christmas carols or featured on Christmas cards. According to Matthew 2:16, Herod became "exceedingly angry" that the wise men didn't report back to him and proceeded to massacre all male children under two years of age in the Bethlehem area, so he could eliminate a rival to his throne. But King Herod's violent opposition to Jesus was in vain. God was prepared for His Son's entry into this world and knew how Herod would react. As prophesied in Jeremiah 31:15 and Hosea 11:1, as recalled in Matthew 2:18 and Matthew 2:15, Jesus had been taken to Egypt by Joseph & Mary to wait in safety until Herod's wrath died with him.

Just like the Grinch ultimately learned in the cartoon, Herod couldn't stop or undo Christmas: it came, just the same! Jesus came into this world because He was sent by His Father on a mission. He took the form of a bondservant, and lived as a man among mankind (*Philippians 2:7*). Jesus was not deterred or distracted from His purpose for any reason. His enemies were unsuccessful in their opposition to Him until it was time for Jesus to take our place on the cross and face God's judgment against all sin for all time. So for all of you who find the Christmas season and all its demands a bit daunting at times, remember that the real reason for the season is all you need to focus on.

- An Internal Administration Cmte. motion to increase the 2021 Physical Plant BLI by \$7,700 was adopted.
- An Internal Administration Cmte. motion to donate up to 30 metal chairs to a sister church was approved.
- The Church passed the Finance Cmte. motion to increase the 2021 Online Payments BLI by \$200.

Expected at the December Business Meeting:

• The Finance Cmte. will offer a motion to approve its recommended 2022 Church budget of \$209,462, which is \$27,464 less than the 2021 adjusted budget amount of \$236,926.

Celebrating Christmas. Compared to Christmas 2020, Christmas 2021 will

have fewer restrictions but COVID cautions are



still in effect. There will not be a Christmas Dinner, Parsonage Open House, or caroling. The Christmas Cantata will be scaled back to a more modest program on Sunday, Dec. 19 with smaller Christmas-themed specials throughout December. There will be a Christmas Eve candlelight service on Dec. 24 at 6:00 pm.

Nov. 28. Captain Lawrence "LT" Tyler will be singing on Sunday, Nov. 28 from his new gospel album "God of Second Chances" as well as Christmas songs to start the Advent season.

Lottie Moon Christmas Offering goal set at \$2,000. Nov. 29-Dec. 5 is the week of prayer for the 2021 Lottie Moon Christmas Offering for International Missions. Together, we and the International Mission Board are able to send out more than 3,600 missionaries to share the Gospel all over the world. The national goal is \$185 million; BBC's is \$2,000. Last year, IMB missionaries engaged 247 people groups, planted over 18,000 churches and baptized over 86,000 people. Please pray about a sacrificial gift for foreign missions.

COVID update. After several weeks of mask-free worship in late October and early November, Montgomery County again imposed an indoor face mask requirement effective Nov. 20 due to a rise in COVID-19 transmission from "moderate" to "substantial". As such, Barnesville Baptist Church has returned to our previous practices of wearing face masks. Masks are provided at the entrances for those who need one.

BBC will continue to follow the requirements issued by the county and state. When the transmission rate decreases or the vaccination rate increases to a level that allows the mask mandate to be relaxed, we will adhere to that guidance.

Thank you for your patience and cooperation as we have done our best to follow the rules, respect one another, and get through this season of challenge together with love and unity. In this season of giving thanks, let us appreciate that we are able to worship and fellowship together as we serve God's Kingdom.

Gifts for children. Please contact Cindy Moore to sign up to donate Christmas gifts to needy children. We have 28 names from the SBC church plant in Baltimore and 12 from CareNet of Frederick. Gifts are due to BBC by Sunday, Dec. 12. Money can also be given by hand or online for those who would like to participate but aren't able to shop in person.

BCM/D annual meeting report. BBC messengers Danny Moore and Lee Michael attended the 185th Baptist Convention of Maryland/Delaware annual meeting on Monday, Nov. 15 at First Baptist Church of Laurel in Prince George's County. Pastor Glenn Swanson of Bayside Baptist Church was elected BCM/D president. The 365 messengers present adopted a \$6.9 million budget and a resolution in support of sexual abuse survivors. Pastor Danny served on the 2021 Resolutions Committee that recommended the resolution; Lee Michael will represent the Montgomery Baptist Association on the BCM/D Committee on Order of Business through 2023.
