2021 was another year of COVID-related challenges, but BBC was blessed by God in so many ways. We have been able to worship together every Sunday since Feb. 28, we celebrated 150 years of God's faithfulness in September, and we were able to hold VBS, Easter, and Christmas services. It really didn't matter that we had to deal with delta and omicron when we had the Alpha & Omega leading and guiding us throughout the year. BBC was able to share the good news of Jesus in 2021 with our local community and around the world in ways we could have never imagined just a few years ago. God also supplied all our needs in a highexpense year as we took care of His property. Another highlight for 2021 was the baptisms of nine believers. And don't forget the 17-year cicadas made their above-ground appearance this spring! Here are some of the more interesting and important Church news headlines from the past 12 months:

January: 2021 began with services online only

February: Sunday School by Zoom began Feb. 7; in-person services resumed Feb. 28 with two-service set-up

March: two baptisms, regular worship schedule resumed Mar. 21

April: Easter sunrise service held on BBC grounds, 150<sup>th</sup> polo shirts distributed

September: one baptism, new carpet installed, three-day 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration held with History Night, Fellowship Picnic & Open House, and Worship Service

October: BBC hosted the 86<sup>th</sup> Montgomery Baptist Association meeting online, 30 enjoyed fellowship at Summers Farm

November: Advent season opened with LT Tyler in concert, sanctuary air conditioner replaced

December: 40 children sponsored for Christmas gifts in Baltimore and Frederick, Christmas celebrated with BBC talents

Report from the Monthly Business Meeting in December:


The Church accepted the Finance Cmte.'s motion to approve its 2022 Budget proposal.
