The Pew Perspective

Like "the fear of the Lord" discussed last month, the "wrath of God" is another Old Testament term worth unpacking. While some think God's wrath is unreasonable retribution from a cosmic killjoy, it is actually His principled and unyielding opposition to sin, evil, and unrighteousness in individual people's lives and in the fallen world system. In its ultimate fulfillment as promised in *Revelation*, God's wrath will judge and banish unrepentant sinners from His presence and remove the power and presence of sin from the lives of His children forever. Here are a few key facts to know about God's wrath:

God's wrath is a reflection of His perfect character. God is perfect in His love, perfect in His holiness, and perfect in His justice. He cannot forget, dismiss, or minimize sin. "Your eyes are too pure to look on evil; you cannot tolerate wrongdoing" (Habakkuk 1:13). He must respond to evil with judgment to be true to His own nature.

God's wrath is especially aroused by willful and defiant ungratefulness, rebelliousness, and unbelief. When God banished Adam & Eve from the Garden of Eden for their sin and disobedience, that was an example of His wrath in action. The years that Israel spent wandering in the wilderness before entering the Promised Land were similarly judgment for the hardheartedness and unbelief of His chosen people. "Remember! Do not forget how you provoked the Lord your God to wrath in the wilderness" (Deuteronomy 9:7).

God's wrath is tempered by His mercy. God still loves us even when He punishes us. He would rather that He did not have to punish us because we would instead choose to respect and obey Him in love. "...You are a gracious and merciful God, slow to anger and abundant in lovingkindness, One who relents from doing harm" (Jonah 4:2). For as many stories there are in the Old Testament where God judged the wicked, He was also quick to forgive and hold back punishment and suffering when His people repented and returned to Him.

God's wrath will not be held back forever. While we live, we have the opportunity to respond to God's offer of grace. But there will come a time when our decision becomes permanent; after death there is only judgment for those lost in sin (Hebrews 9:27). The world is also living in an age of grace before the final judgment. As it says in Revelation 6:10, there will come a time when God will finally end evil once and for all: "...'How long, O Lord, holy and true, until You judge and avenge our blood on those who dwell on the earth"?

God would rather forgive us than inflict His wrath. Just like the father of the prodigal son in *Luke 15* was anxiously awaiting to forgive and restore his wayward child, God rejoices in reconciling with sinners. In *Micah 7:18*, God's eagerness to show us kindness over punishment is evident: "Who is a God like You, pardoning iniquity and passing over the transgression of the remnant of His heritage? He does not retain His anger forever, because He delights in mercy".

God sent His Son to suffer His wrath in our place. This is the good news of Easter: Jesus died on the cross to pay the penalty for our sins so that we might have forgiveness and eternal life through faith in Him. "For God did not appoint us to wrath, but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, who died for us..." (I Thessalonians 5:9-10). When we accept Jesus' offer of salvation, we are freed from God's wrath.
