The Pastor's Spotlight

I would like to invite you to join us for Sunday School each week at 9:30 am; we have classes for all ages. This quarter's lessons have been focused on the work of the Holy Spirit in our lives as believers. God has begun a work that He will continue until He comes back or until the believer leaves this life and goes to Him. *"For I am confident of this very thing, that He who began a good work in you will perfect it until the day of Christ Jesus" (Philippians 1:6).*

The Apostle Paul reminds us that God is great and is able to use every situation to strengthen our faith and to teach us His way and will for our lives through the Holy Spirit. In Ephesians 5:19-20, Paul delivers instructions on how to live a life filled with the Holy Spirit: "...[speak] to one another with psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit. Sing and make music from your heart to the Lord, always giving thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ". First, we are to speak to fellow Christians with a joyful attitude of worship like we find in the songs and hymns of thanksgiving. We are to be appreciative to be able to share conversations with fellow believers, uplifting each other in the name of love, Jesus. Second, we are to walk in the Spirit and offer up to the Lord songs of worship and praise drawn from the deep wells of gratitude in our heart, so that our lips are always full of kind words and righteous thoughts. Third, we are to have an attitude of thanksgiving that God has given us His Spirit to dwell in our lives. That same thankfulness should be regularly shown to and shared with unbelievers, our families, our church family, and especially the Lord. Fourth, when we are filled with the Holy Spirit, we will be in submission to God's will in our lives, and towards fellow believers. Instead of selfishness or pride, we are to be grateful. Remember, just because we are saved and forgiven, it does not make us better, it makes us blessed. Because of Jesus' love for us, we are to approach every conversation "in the Spirit of the Lord" to bring honor to Him. Please keep praying, trusting, and believing in the mighty name of Jesus.

The Pew Perspective

Every two years, BBC selects its officers and workers, both renewing the service of long-time servants and seeking out fresh faces to step up and use their talents for God's Kingdom. We can look to the example of the early church as we seek out servantleaders to direct the ministries and activities of our congregation. The selection of seven workers in Acts 6:1-7 helps us understand the qualities needed in those called to serve.

First, church workers must have a good reputation (Acts 6:3). This means much more than being popular or well-liked. It is ultimately about character and maturity, men and women who can be trusted with the resources of the church to solve the needs of the church. In first-century Jerusalem, the need was for feeding widows. For some reason, the Jewish widows were being fed, but the Greek widows had been overlooked. Just like with our own BBC Food Ministry, the early church needed faithful volunteers to make sure that the daily work of the church was taken care of so the apostles could continue with their unique calling to preach and pray (Acts 6:4).

Second, church workers need to be Spirit-full and wise (Acts 6:3). It isn't enough that someone has technical skill or ability to accomplish tasks and programs, but also thinks and acts like a Christian as they represent the church, and more importantly Christ. Imagine how much more outcry there would have been if those Greek widows had been treated roughly or rudely by those sent by the church to attend to their needs! Each one of us are ambassadors for the Lord (II Corinthians 5:20) as we interact with people, even more so when representing BBC through our ministries. Church workers need to be known for their kindness, grace, patience, and understanding as we encounter those who might be witnessing Christian behavior for the first time.

Third, church workers need to be practical problem solvers (Acts 6:3). When there's a leak in the baptistry, bats roosting in the parsonage attic, or seniors who need a ride to the doctor's office, we need people who can fix the problem or resolve the situation so needs are met and God is honored. The Greek widows were hungry, and no amount of prayer or Bible study about helping the poor was going to help them until food was purchased, meals were prepared, and distribution was planned. The apostles delegated responsibility to trusted workers, who got the job done on time and in order.

And fourth, church workers need to be unity-protectors. The difference in treatment between the Jewish and Greek widows, most likely unintentional, had the potential to cause major division and dissension within the church (Acts 6:1). It is noteworthy that the seven chosen men in Acts 6:5 all had Greek names, meaning they probably also spoke Greek and were part of the Greek community they were sent to serve, which helps to explain why the "whole multitude" was "pleased" (Acts 6:5). For us at BBC, serving on a committee or holding a position isn't just a job or a title. It is an act of Christian service and worship that has spiritual importance. Doing our jobs well, in the right way, and with the proper spiritual mindset protects the unity and health of our congregation.

The end result of the seven-man Food Ministry team's work is evident in Acts 6:7: "Then the word of God spread, and the number of the disciples multiplied greatly in Jerusalem, and a great many of the priests were obedient to the faith". When we obey God through our service, the Gospel is preached, new believers are added to the flock, and God's name is praised among all. What is God calling you to do with your time, talent, and treasure to honor Him?

Business Meeting Briefs


Report from the Monthly Business Meeting in July:


