Content for the Pew Perspective Lee Michael

Jesus' royal descent from King David is the first fact Matthew shared about Christ in his gospel: "...Jesus Christ, the son of David..." (Matthew 1:1). "Son of David", which called to mind for Matthew's Jewish audience not only the right to rule, but mercy and healing, was used 10 times in *Matthew*, more than all the other Gospels combined. Matthew was also making that point that while David was a shepherd who became a king. Jesus was a King who became a Shepherd. As a shepherd-king, David was brought up from humble beginnings to lead Israel; as a king-shepherd, the King of Kings was brought down (Philippians 2:7) to tend the lost sheep of the house of Israel (Matthew 15:24). As Matthew introduced our Lord in his version of the Christmas story, he used several titles and names to make the link between David and Christ clear: As "King of the Jews", Christ was the Ruler, as "Jesus", Christ was the Redeemer, and as "Emmanuel", Christ was the Resider.

In Matthew 2:2, the magi asked about Jesus, "...Where is He who has been born King of the Jews"? As David's descendant, born in David's city of Bethlehem, Matthew made it clear that Jesus was the rightful Ruler of Israel, the shepherd who would guide and lead His sheep, just like King David. The Lord said of David in II Samuel 7:8, "...I took you from the sheepfold, from following the sheep, to be ruler over My people, over Israel...". Jesus affirmed His role as Ruler of His flock in John 10:27, saying, "My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me...".

Matthew explained the meaning of the name "Jesus" in *Matthew 1:21*, defining it as "...*He will save His people from their sins*". As Israel's Shepherd, Jesus was also their Redeemer, who would protect and save His sheep from danger and death. As David told King Saul, he rescued his sheep by fighting off wild animals who would otherwise devour them: "...*Your servant used to keep his father's sheep, and when a lion or a bear came and took a lamb out of the flock, I went out after it and struck it, and delivered the lamb from its mouth..." (I Samuel 17:34-35). Similarly, Jesus understood His role as Redeemer meant putting His own life on the line to save His sheep: "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd gives His life for the sheep" (John 10:11). And so the Shepherd became the Lamb of sacrifice on the cross.*

The second name Matthew applied to Christ was "Emmanuel", which, according to *Matthew 1:23* (quoting *Isaiah 7:14*), means "God with us". Instead of a distant God in heaven or an inaccessible king in his palace, Jesus, like a shepherd, would reside with His sheep. Being a shepherd was no office job; it required "abiding in the fields" (Luke 2:8) day and night with His flock, having

firsthand experience of their daily habits just as the sheep became familiar with their Shepherd's voice. David was well-known to be with his sheep. Whether it was Samuel, Saul, or his father Jesse looking for him, David could be found with his flocks: *"There remains yet the youngest, and there he is, keeping the sheep; ...your son David, who is with the sheep" (I Samuel 16:11; 19).* Jesus explained His deep and personal connection to His own as a shepherd in *John 10:14: "I am the good shepherd; and I know My sheep, and am known by My own."*

Both David and Jesus were good shepherds and kings, ruling over, redeeming, and residing with their flocks. Matthew, in introducing the Lord as the Son of David, the King of the Jews, Jesus, and Emmanuel early on in his gospel, made it very clear who Christ was. As we celebrate Christmas this year, let us remember that Jesus is our king and shepherd too.
