

The Pew Perspective

Jesus' favorite title for Himself was "the Son of Man", which He used over 80 times in the Gospels. While there are many examples in the Old Testament of "son of man" being used to describe an ordinary human, Jesus was calling upon the reference to Daniel 7:13 where "the Son of Man" was a divine title. Probably the most dramatic use of "the Son of Man" by Jesus occurred in *Matthew 26:63-65* (also recorded in *Mark* and Luke), when the Jewish Chief Priest Caiaphas demanded to know who Jesus considered Himself to be in v. 63: "...Tell us if You are the Christ, the Son of God"! Jesus answered Caiaphas by saying, "...you will see the Son of Man sitting at the right hand of the Power, and coming on the clouds of heaven" (v. 64). Most explanations of Jesus' response focus on the first half of the description, about Jesus sitting on God's throne, which certainly is a powerful statement about Jesus' divine nature. But it turns out that the second half of the answer, about coming on the clouds of heaven, was not merely poetic language, but was just as powerful a statement about Jesus' deity.

Daniel 7:13 describes the "Son of Man" as "coming with the clouds of heaven"! Multiple verses in the Old Testament described the Lord God as the only One who rides the clouds: "There is no one like the God of Jeshurun, who rides the heavens to help you, and in His excellency on the clouds (Deuteronomy 33:26); "Sing to God, sing praises to His name; extol Him who rides on the clouds, by His name Yah, and rejoice before Him" (Psalm 68:4); "Behold, the Lord rides on a swift cloud..." (Isaiah 19:1); Psalm 68:33, Psalm 104:3. The language of God as a Cloud Rider was originally taken from a title for the Canaanite storm god Baal (of Mount Carmel fame). Biblical writers had no problem taking an honorific for deity from their pagan neighbors and applying it to the one true God; the people of Israel would have immediately understood the divine reference. So the Son of Man of Daniel 7:13 was not just a mortal human, an elevated angel, or some other heavenly character. The Son of Man was a Cloud Rider who was co-equal with God. For Jesus to take on the "Son of Man" title as His preferred title while teaching, preaching, and healing here on this world, He was proclaiming Himself to be the Lord God each and every time He called Himself that.

Caiaphas, as the top Jewish religious leader, knew exactly what Jesus was saying and what He was referencing when He called Himself "the Son of Man": that He was the Messiah, equal with God, God Himself. Caiaphas' reaction in *Matthew 26:65* was immediate and explosive: "Then the high priest tore his clothes, saying, 'He has spoken blasphemy! What further need do we have of witnesses? Look, now you have heard His blasphemy!" After dragging through an unsuccessful trial up to that point, Caiaphas had all he needed to condemn Jesus as a heretic using His own words.

There are many verses in the Gospels that show that Jesus claimed to be God. *John* is known for its "I AM" statements and describing Jesus as the Son of God . Yet Jesus' favorite description of Himself as "the Son of Man" is just as much a powerful declaration that He is God as any other title.
