The Pastor's Spotlight





The Pew Perspective

The story in *II Kings 5* about the Syrian commander Naaman washing seven times in the Jordan River to be healed from his leprosy is well known, but what he did next is not. Naaman asked the prophet Elisha for dirt, as much as two mules could carry back to Syria. It wasn't because soil from Israel was better than soil from Syria, it was because Naaman wanted to be connected with the God of Israel. Understanding the thinking of ancient biblical peoples about the relationships among lands, peoples, and the gods they worshiped will help us understand and interpret several unusual passages in the Scriptures.

The peoples of Naaman's and Elisha's day believed that the world was divided into nations each with gods that ruled over their own peoples and lands (Deuteronomy 4:19, 29:26, 32:8,17). After mankind's rebellion against God's authority at Babel (Genesis 11), the Lord scattered them over the earth and apportioned them their own lands. As Paul explained to the Athenians, God set "...every nation of men to dwell on all the face of the earth, and has determined their preappointed times and the boundaries of their dwellings..." (Acts 17:26). Whereas the Lord had sent the Gentile nations away from His rule and revelation, He set his attention and affection on a chosen people that would come from Abraham. "For the Lord's portion is His people; Jacob is the place of His inheritance" (Deuteronomy 32:9). Not only did the Lord call out a people, he selected a specific land, Israel, that His chosen people would occupy (Genesis 12:1-3).

Having experienced the miraculous healing power of the God of Israel, Naaman would never again put his faith in the gods of Syria, but rather he would be forever committed to the Lord. As the military leader of Israel's enemy, Naaman would be physically separated from the land of the God he gave his allegiance to, so he wanted a physical connection to bring home with him. Whether Naaman intended to build himself an altar for worship on a small patch of Israeli soil or something else is unclear, but what was obvious was that Naaman had no further interest in worshiping the Syrian nation's deity in the temple of Rimmon (II Kings 5:18).

In another situation, future king David had not just physical safety but religious concerns about being driven out of the land of Judah by a jealous King Saul. When David appealed to Saul to relent from his pursuit, he complained about Saul's men, "...for they have driven me out this day from sharing in the inheritance of the Lord, saying, 'Go, serve other gods'". (I Samuel 26:19). David's concern was not that God's authority was limited to the boundaries of Israel, but that God's people belonged in God's land, and to be outside of God's territory was to put himself under the jurisdiction of foreign gods.

The Jews weren't the only people to hold such a belief. The Philistines recognized that the God of Israel had taken part of their land, in their very own temple of Dagon, their chief god. In *I Samuel 5*, it is recorded that the Ark of the Covenant, taken by the Philistines from the Israelites in battle, was deposited in the Philistine temple as a war prize. Overnight, the idol of Dagon had broken and fallen before the Ark of the

Report from the Monthly Business Meeting in April:


 There was no Old Business pending before the Church.

Covenant, its head and hands on the ground. The Philistines saw that as the God of Israel defeating Dagon, and therefore that ground had been seized by Israel's God and off-limits to the worshipers of Dagon. "Therefore neither the priests of Dagon nor any who come into Dagon's house tread on the threshold of Dagon in Ashdod to this day" (I Samuel 5:5).

The prophet Daniel also picked up the theme of nations being overseen by spiritual forces, noting that Persia, Greece, and Israel were under the authority of specific "princes", well understood as spiritual beings (Daniel 10:13, 20–21). The Apostle Paul carried that same understanding into the New Testament with his repeated references to the geographic terms of "principalities" and "powers" with regard to spiritual warfare and Christ's resurrection victory over the powers of darkness (Romans 8:38; Ephesians 3:10, 6:12; Colossians 1:16, 2:15). As Christians, we can rest assured in the knowledge that our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ has redeemed and conquered every tribe and tongue and people and nation, and that "the kingdoms of this world have become the kingdoms of our Lord and of His Christ, and He shall reign forever and ever" (Revelation 11:15)!
