



The Pew Perspective

The baptism and temptation of Jesus were important historical events that preceded His ministry. They also have interesting spiritual parallels in the exodus of Israel from Egypt. In both cases, (1) God's son was (2) brought forth through water to (3) begin ministry but was first taken into the wilderness for (4) testing. However, where one failed, the Other succeeded.

First, both Israel and Jesus were called the son of God, the Father's representative in this world to do His will. In the Old Testament, God told Moses to explain to Pharoah that, "Israel is My son, My firstborn" (Exodus 4:23). Similarly, in the Gospels, God said of Jesus during His baptism, "This is My...Son" (Matthew 3:17).

Second, both Israel and Jesus were called by God through water. Deliberate use of the Greek root schizo (to split) in the New Testament account of Jesus' baptism links it to the Old Testament story of the Exodus. Just as "the waters were divided" (Exodus 14:21) to bring Israel out of Egypt and into God's purpose, the heavens were "parted" or "torn open" (Mark 1:10) upon Jesus' baptism as the inauguration for His ministry. The following verse in Mark, where the Father in heaven called Jesus "My beloved Son" (Mark 1:11; Matthew 3:17), links another Old Testament idea to Jesus. "Beloved" in Mark 1:11 is the same term (Jedidiah) used of Solomon in II Samuel 12:24-25. Just as Solomon was the human son and heir of King David, the Lord was stating that Jesus, His Son, was also King. Jude 5 helps to bring all those Exodus and Mark themes together by explaining that the Lord Jesus Himself "... saved the people out of the land of Egypt".

Third, both Israel and Jesus were called into the Lord's service, where they were to endure suffering, defeat evil, and build a kingdom. Israel endured 40 years of wilderness wandering, while Jesus experienced 40 days of temptation. Israel conquered the Promised Land by battling pagan nations but allowed some enemies to escape; Jesus taught, preached, and healed and died as a perfect sacrifice for sin once for all. Israel set up a God-worshiping kingdom that fell into sin, split apart, and was eventually carried away, never to return to its former glory. Jesus set up an everlasting kingdom where one day every knee will bow and every tongue confess that He is King of Kings and Lord of Lords.

Fourth, both Israel and Jesus were sent into the wilderness for testing, for the purpose, as Moses explained to Israel in Deuteronomy 8:2: "...to humble you and test you, to know what was in your heart, whether you would keep His commandments or not". Both were given the same three tests, which Israel failed when tried by God and Jesus overcame when tempted by Satan. The first was the test of hunger, for which Israel complained against the Lord and Moses many times. Satan's first temptation of a hungry Christ was that He should "command that these stones become bread" (Matthew 4:3). Yet Jesus countered with the warning over Israel's rebellious hunger that "man shall not live by bread alone; but man lives by every word that proceeds from the mouth of the Lord" (Deuteronomy 8:3). Jesus told His disciples in John 4:34 that, "My food is to do

Business Meeting Briefs


Report from the Monthly Business Meeting in May:

the will of Him who sent Me, and to finish His work". The second trial was the test of trust, which Israel failed at Massah (Exodus 17:1-7) when they lacked faith in God and Moses to provide for their thirst. Satan challenged Jesus to throw Himself off the Temple (Matthew 4:6) to make God prove His faithfulness toward His Son. However, Jesus hearkened back to Israel's disbelief in God, responding that "You shall not test the Lord your God as you test Him in Massah" (Deuteronomy 6:16). Jesus later preached, "...My judgment is righteous, because I do not seek My own will but the will of the Father who sent Me" (John 5:30).

The third temptation was a test of loyalty. The Ten Commandments weren't even carved before the children of Israel began worshiping a golden calf. Despite warnings from Moses and Joshua, Israel under its judges and kings so easily forsook the Lord for the false gods of their enemies. Satan wanted Christ to forsake His Father and serve him as king of this world in exchange for power: "fall down and worship me" (Matthew 4:9). Yet Jesus rejected the devil's advance with Moses' words: "You shall fear the Lord your God and serve Him...You shall not go after other gods" (Deuteronomy 6:13-14). Indeed, when Christ came to His greatest trial of whether to trust and obey the Lord, He triumphed, saying, "Father, if it is Your will, take this cup away from Me; nevertheless not My will, but Yours, be done" (Luke 22:42).
