The Pew Perspective

One of the more challenging passages of the New Testament is found in *I Peter 3:18-22*. The Apostle Peter covers a lot of ground in a few sentences: Jesus' death, Noah's Ark and the Flood, imprisoned spirits, baptism, and resurrection. Peter's first-century audience would have easily understood his references, and once we do, we will also receive a powerful blessing of encouragement.

The challenge of interpreting the meaning of the "spirits in prison" of I Peter 3:18-22 is helped by understanding that they are the same group of evil spirits described as "angels who sinned" in II Peter 2:4-5 and as "angels who did not keep their proper domain" in Jude 6-7, all referring back to the "sons of God" in Genesis 6:1-4. Taking all the verses from *Genesis*, Peter's epistles, and Jude together, the Bible explains that for the offense of cohabitating with human women in the days of Noah, rebellious and wicked angels were permanently imprisoned by God in the realm of the dead to await the final judgment. Millennia later, Christ, between His death and resurrection, visited those bound demons (I Peter 3:19) to let them know that His death was not a sign of defeat, but His impending victory. Just like the eight on Noah's Ark who were delivered through the Flood endured suffering but emerged unharmed and saved, Christ's temporary suffering and death on the cross was a permanent means of salvation and victory (I Peter 3:20).

The connection to baptism requires knowing the extrabiblical text of *I Enoch*, a well-known piece of Jewish literature that Peter and Jude referenced in their epistles for their original first-century audience. In the story of *I Enoch*, the antediluvian patriarch Enoch was asked by the bound demons of Genesis 6 to request that God forgive and release them from their underworld prison. God's answer was a resounding "no", so Enoch descended to the imprisoned spirits and informed them of their permanent punishment. Just like the Apostle Paul considered Adam a type of Christ in Romans 5, the Apostle Peter used Enoch as a type of Christ in *I Peter 3*: Christ, like Enoch, also descended to the realm of the dead, in Christ's case to inform the long-imprisoned spirits that His death and resurrection ensured their eternal destruction.

Peter's point to us regarding baptism is that just like Enoch and Christ, we too witness to the bound demons and the spiritual forces of evil in this world when we participate in believer's baptism. In I Peter 3:21, Peter likens baptism to a pledge of loyalty toward God. Every time a Christian follows Jesus in baptism, we share in His death (Romans 6:3-4), which gives us an opportunity to witness to the powers of darkness that here's one more soul that they'll never get, here's one more loss and defeat on the scoreboard. In other words, baptism is a means to participate in spiritual warfare and proclaim our eternal

Just as we shared in Christ's death through baptism in *Romans 6*, we will rule with Him and judge fallen angels in His name (*I Corinthians 6:3*).

Peter's encouragement to us in times of suffering and trial is to rejoice, knowing that we will be blessed (*I Peter 3:14*) and can look forward, with expectant hope, to our ultimate deliverance and salvation in Christ (*I Peter 1:6-9*).

SBC news. The 2023 Southern Baptist Convention Annual Meeting was held in New Orleans, LA on Jun. 13-14 with almost 19,000 in attendance; the theme was "Serving the

Lord, Serving Others". SBC President Bart Barber of Farmersville, TX was reelected after a run-off election. Seventy-nine International Missions Board missionaries were commissioned for overseas service. The messengers affirmed decisions by the

SBC Executive Committee that three churches were not in friendly cooperation. The Abuse Reform Implementation Task Force (ARITF) was renewed for an additional year. An SBC constitutional amendment to define qualifications for the pastorate received $2/3^{\text{rds}}$ approval, but must also receive another vote of support at the 2024 SBC annual meeting to be held Jun. 13-14 in Indianapolis, IN.
