Who is the Angel of the Lord in the Old Testament? Is the Angel just one of God's heavenly servants or something-Someone--more? I won't keep you waiting for the answer: those in the Old Testament knew that the Angel of the Lord was equal to God and the writers of the New Testament identified the capital-A Angel with the second Person of the Godhead, Jesus Christ. Just as with last month's column about the Old Testament roots of *John 1*'s description of Jesus as the Word, knowing more about the linkages between the two testaments strengthens our understanding of Jesus' role and identity as the co-equal and co-eternal Son of God.

The harrowing story in *Genesis 22* of God's command for Abraham to sacrifice Isaac is the earliest sign in the Scriptures that the Angel of the Lord was indeed the Lord God. In *Genesis 22:1-2*, it is clear in the text that it was God who spoke to Abraham: "Now it came to pass after these things that God tested Abraham...". Yet in verses 11-12, it was the Angel of the Lord that told Abraham to stop and who noted that, "...for now I know that you fear God, since you have not withheld your son, your only son, from Me", with "Me" referring to the Angel, and yet also the same God in *Genesis 22:1* who originally instructed Abraham to offer sacrifice.

Another deliberate mid-stream name-switch happened with Moses at the burning bush in *Exodus 3:1-4*. In reverse order to *Genesis 22*, it was the Angel of the Lord that called out to Moses: "And the Angel of the Lord appeared to him in a flame of fire from the midst of a bush...", and then changed His name to "Lord": "So when the Lord saw that he turned aside to look, God called to him from the midst of the bush". The deliberate blurring of the Angel of the Lord and the Lord in the same story is another indication that the Old Testament equated the two names with the same being.

Jacob (Israel), whose wrestling match with God in *Genesis* 32 resulted in Jacob having a limp, had more up close and personal interactions with the Lord than almost anyone in biblical times. It is interesting how Israel, at the end of his life, chose to describe God. During his blessing of his sons, Israel specifically identified God and the Angel as the same being. In *Genesis* 48:15, it reads, "...God, before whom my fathers Abraham and Isaac walked, the God who has fed me all my life long to this day, the Angel who has redeemed me from all evil, may He bless the lads...". Grammar is important here: if Israel intended to distinguish between God and the Angel, he would have said, "may They bless the lads". Israel's use of the singular He to refer to both God and the Angel demonstrates that Israel understood both names to refer to the same being.

In Exodus 23:20, God spoke to Moses about His divine guidance for the children of Israel after departing Egypt: "Behold, I send an Angel before you to keep you in the way and to bring you into the place which I have prepared." The detail about the Angel's role in the Exodus is repeated in Judges 2:1-2: "Then the Angel of the LORD...said: "I led you up from Egypt and brought you to the land of which I swore

to your fathers...". It is fascinating that in the New Testament, Jude 5 confidently assigns the role of divine protector of Israel during the Exodus to Jesus: "Now I want to remind you, although you once fully knew it, that Jesus, who saved a people out of the land of Egypt, afterward destroyed those who did not believe". The Old Testament, obviously, never named Jesus as having a role in the Exodus. And yet Jude, under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, linked the Angel in the Old Testament to Jesus in the New Testament. If the Old Testament Angel of the Exodus, known to be equal to God, was Jesus, then logically it follows that Jesus is equal to God, a key Christian doctrine to this day. Gideon had a fascinating experience sharing with meal with

the Lord/Angel of the Lord in *Judges 6*. The rapid-fire switching between the use of the names Lord and Angel of the Lord in the account seem to be the author's way of merging the two together, that somehow the two Persons interacting with Gideon were somehow also the same Person, and the same God, at the same time.
